I am thankful for the faculty, staff, students and the leaders of the BCM who guided, assist and point me in the right direction during my tenure as Principal of this esteemed college. I also express my deepest appreciation to my family for their unwavering support and willingness to follow me and provide a solid base for this mission.

The vision for a Deemed University is on track; the mission of the institute is being accomplished as transformed students are commissioned and sent out on their graduation annually to fulfill responsibilities in society with higher calling. The visible and invisible growth has been steady and gradual, and all members of the community are the better for it. I wish the next leaders and the community all the blessings and favours from the Almighty as they take the next step forward in the journey.

## B.GENERAL REPORT:

**1. UESI North-East Mizoram Annual General Meeting:** The Evangelical Wing (HEW) of the Institute hosted the UESI North-East Mizoram Annual General Meeting during April 14 – 15, 2018. Delegates from different parts of the the North East attended the meeting. We are thankful for the success of the programme.

**2. Valedictory Ceremony:** Valedictory Ceremony of the Institute was organized at the Convention Centre, Lunglei on 24<sup>th</sup> May 2018. Dr. C. Vanlalramsanga, IES, Secretary, UD&PA graced the occasion as the Chief Guest. BCM Choir presented a beautiful song. The College Annual Magazine 'Dokimos' was released in this program by Rev. R. Zohmingliana, AGS i/c Service, BCM. The programme concluded with a benediction by Rev. Dr. C. Vanlaldika, AGS i/c Mission, BCM. Community feast was shared at the HATIM Campus, Chanmari after the programme.

### 3. NSS Programmes:

1) Public Urinals were constructed at Bazar Veng, Zobawk and Venghlun cemetary in the month of May, 2018.

2) **World Environment Day** was observed and a programme was organized at the HATIM Auditorium on June 05, 2018 in collaboration with the Environment and Forest Department and NYK, Lunglei.

3) On June 06, 2018, **International Yoga Day** was observed and a *Seminar on Health and Physical Fitness* was organized at the HATIM Auditorium in collaboration with the NYK, Lunglei and NCC Cadets, Govt. High School, Lunglei.

4) Trees were planted at Assam Rifles Helipad, Sethlun on July 14, 2018 in collaboration with NYK, Lunglei and 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion Assam Rifle.

5) HATIM Red Ribbon Club in collaboration with NSS Unit, HATIM organized a **Voluntary Blood Donation Camp** on the occasion of the 72<sup>nd</sup> Independence Day at the HATIM Auditorium on 16 August, 2018. Medical Team from CHS and Civil Hospital, Lunglei came for collection of blood. The details are as follows: 140 Units of blood was donated (Male – 98 & Female – 42) and distributed as under: Christian Hospital Serkawn – 59 Units (Male - 45 and Female - 14)

Civil Hospital, Lunglei – 81 Units (Male – 53 and Female – 28)

- 6) Cleanliness Drive was organized in observance of the 49<sup>th</sup> NSS Day in collaboration with HSC on 24 September, 2018.
- 7) On 04<sup>th</sup> October, 2018, the NSS Unit of HATIM participated at the District Level Youth Parliament organized by NYK, Lunglei.
- 8) On 28<sup>th</sup> January, 2019, the NSS Unit of HATIM also participated in Youth Parliament at Lunglei Government College and won the 3<sup>rd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> prizes.
- 9) The NSS Unit also participated in State Level Youth Parliament at Aizawl on 07 February, 2019 and won a consolation prize.
- 10) The NSS Unit constructed Public Urinal at Lungpuizawl during 4<sup>th</sup> – 11<sup>th</sup> February, 2019.
- 11) On 27<sup>th</sup> February, 2019, the NSS Unit attended a meeting on District Level Cleanliness organized by the UD&PA Department.
- 12) On 8<sup>th</sup> March, 2019, volunteers of the NSS Unit took part in the Clean River Nghasih Project organised by the UD&PA Department.

**4. New Admission:** Entrance examination for new students (2018 – 2021 Batch) was held on the 28 May, 2018 and on the following days, i.e. 29 and 30 May, 2018, interview was held and result was declared on 30<sup>th</sup> May, 2018. We are blessed with 88 new students in this academic session.

**5. Orientation of Staff:** After semester break, the Residence Staff enter their respective residences on 29 June, 2018 and on the night of this day, orientation was organized at the Ladies Residence-II Chapel at Kawmzawl. Orientation was conducted by the Principal. Orientation for the Administrative Staff and Teaching faculty was organized on 02 July, 2018 at the HATIM Conference Hall.

**6. Parents – Teachers Meeting:** This meeting is organized every year for better co-operation between parents of the students and faculty of the institution. The meeting was organized on 04 July, 2018 at the College Auditorium. The HATIM Rules and Regulations were elaborated to the parents. Questions and Answers hour was also opened.

**7. Workshop on Effective Classroom Management:** We seek to upskill and equip the teaching faculty of the institute through various means. Besides the University sponsored Refreshers' Course and Faculty Development Programmes, the college organise in-service training and orientation programme from time to

**8. Freshers' Day:** A welcome programme for the new students was organized by the HATIM Students' Council on 18 July, 2018 at the College Auditorium. It was a meaningful programme where students new students were warmly welcomed and the HSC excelled itself in putting together a very interesting and commendable programme on the day.

**9. One Day Sports:** One Day Sports was organized by the Games and Sports Committee in collaboration with the HATIM Students' Council on 27 July, 2018 at Thuamluai Field. This was a precursor to the College Week.

**10. Teacher's Day:** Teacher's Day was observed at the HATIM Auditorium on the 5<sup>th</sup> September 2018. The programme was organised by the HATIM Students' Council. All the faculty and staff were given Teacher's Day gift by the students which were very well received and appreciated.

**11. Spiritual Nurturing Program:** Providing academic knowledge is not the only purpose of this College, but to lead them to Christ and be a useful servant. To achieve such purpose, as done in every year, Spiritual Nurturing Program was organized between 14 and 16 September, 2018. The HATIM Evangelical Wings (HEW) took the main role in organizing the program. The theme of the program was 'Be Prepared'. The speaker was Elder Dr. Andrew Lalmangaiha, Assistant Professor, AICS. Holy Communion was prepared by Rev. JC. Vanlalluaia, BCM Electric Pastorate. Students and staff members received spiritual blessings and they re-dedicated their lives to be followers of Jesus Christ.

**12. Career Guidance Seminar:** Mizoram Thalai Kristian Pawl (MTKP) as in their planning organized Career Guidance Program at the HATIM Auditorium on 11 October, 2018. The Career and Academic Counselling Cell of HATIM took care of the necessary thing involved. The resource persons were Mr. Ramnundanga, Asst. Professor, HATIM and Mr. F. Lalremsanga, Asst. Professor, Lunglei Government College.

**13. Annual College Week:** As a part of our effort to provide all round development to the student community, the Annual College Sports Week was organised from 21 – 25 January, 2019. Students took part in various outdoor and indoor sports activities and competition. The community is divided into four houses namely Savidge, Lorrain, Chapman and Clark House after pioneer missionaries from the BMS London, bearing the four colours of the college, namely, Yellow, Red, White and Blue respectively. The overall House Champion in this edition of the Annual Sports Week was the Chapman House. The Closing Function of the week was organised at the HATIM Auditorium on 25<sup>th</sup> January, 2019 in which Dr. K. Pachhunga, MLA, Lunglei South was the Chief Guest.

**14. Solid Waste Management Plant:** Construction of Solid Waste Management Plant has been completed and was inaugurated by Mr. Andrew Lalhruaia, District Urban Development Officer, UD&PA, Lunglei District on 16<sup>th</sup> March 2019 and is being put to good use. The UD & PA Department funded the project which amounts to Rs. 15 Lakhs.

**15. Hill Fest 2019:** The 63<sup>rd</sup> Council Body Meeting established a Committee for Creativity and Innovations and duly appointed two Creative Directors to facilitate creative and positive engagements of the students in the Residence with the aim of forming interest clubs which will ultimately culminate in showcasing of creativity and talents of the students in an Institutional Festival inclusive of all the departmental festivals in one platform and avenue. A survey was taken amongst the students to indicate their areas of interest. The concerned committee identified the areas of interests and formed 12 Interest clubs including Penners, Handicraft, IT, Videography and Photography, Design, Cooking, Theatre, Fine Arts, Music, Debate, Fitness and Choreography clubs.

The Clubs are provided patrons from the staff and faculty, each facilitated by Leaders and Secretaries as appointed by the Hatim Students' Council. Each club organised activities including workshops and seminars with resource persons with expertise in the areas of interests. Each club also organise their own activities during their free time. The college also envisions an annual festival for youths called the Hill Fest which will serve as a platform for the clubs to showcase their creativity and talents. The Hill Fest is to be opened to public for more participation, competition and nurturing of ideas.

The inaugural Hill Fest was organised on March 15&16, 2019 at the Permanent Campus, Kawmzawl with a resounding success. The Hill Fest included an array of activities for the students and youths of the region. As the fest was opened to public for attendance and participation, it attracted a lot of interest not only from

the town, but across the state and the nation as we received entries for participation from all over. More than a thousand people from outside visited the festival. We give thanks to the main sponsor, the North Eastern Council, the co-sponsors the Mizoram Youth Commission and the local sponsors and most of all to God for making the Fest a big success.

**16. Submission of Concept Papers:** For the development of the infrastructure at the permanent campus, project papers were submitted in the form of applications as under to various agencies:

- (i) Skill Development Centre (submitted to Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Government of India)
- (ii) Tourism and Hospitality Development Centre (submitted to the NEC through the Planning Department, Govt. of Mizoram in December 2018.)

**17. Moving to Permanent Campus, Kawmzawl, Pukpui:** On February 14 – 17, 2019, three departments - Department of Commerce, Department of Social Work and Department of English were moved to the Permanent Campus. The Department of Computer Science are still attending class at Chanmari, Lunglei.

#### **18. PERMANENT CAMPUS INFRASTRUCTURE:**

**(i) Administrative Building:** The Administrative Building which was constructed by the NECS was occupied as Principal's Office, Admin Office, Library and classrooms on 18 February 2019.

**(ii) Ladies' Halls of Residence Vertical Extension:** The vertical extension of the Ladies Residence is almost completed. Two floors were extended in which the first is dormitory and top floor is Multipurpose Hall.

**(iii) Obtaining new land and Landlease:** The initial area of the campus was 67.66 bighas (=16.91 acres). We are fortunate that by the grace of God, 12 bighas of land was bought. However, as we are growing, the area we have might not be enough in the near future. So, as we visioned a Deemed University, we requested the Property Committee of the BCM to buy a desirable plot of land. However, since there is no fund for now, this could not be done, but it is our prayer and vision to acquire more land.

The current area of 67.66 bighas is divided into five parts and the respective landlease is also obtained from the government.

**19. VISION AND EXPECTATIONS:**

**1) Preparation for NAAC Accreditation:** We have been preparing for accreditation by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). As the SSR was being prepared according to the manual, we have had to make some necessary changes and adjustments due to the publication of a new manual for inspection in July 2017. We have also attended seminar regarding NAAC organized by Mizoarm University in collaboration with NAAC Bangalore. We hope to be ready soon so that we might invite the NAAC Peer Team for inspection in the later part of 2019.

**2) Academic Block C:** We received a sum of Rs. 8,72,655/- through the 2017 BCM Assembly appeal. This is being utilized for the construction of the Academic Block C. The foundation stone for the block was laid by Rev. R. Zohmingliana, AGS i/c Service, BCM on 16<sup>th</sup> March 2019. The block design is done by the Catalyst Architects and construction work will begin soon. As the existing funds are minimal, we welcome generous donations from patrons and friends of the institution.

**3) Savidge Halls of Residence for the Men:** The present residence for the male students is an Assam type building which is suitable only for temporary accommodation and is also very congested. Repairs and maintenance incur a lot of expenditure every year. We are urgently in need of RCC building to fit the mens which will be named after the pioneer Rev. F.W. Savidge. We are grateful that The Mizoram Baptist Youth Fellowship, the MTKP have resolved to help raise funds this year, and we hope and pray that funds may be raised through other agencies and fellowship organization. We also explore other avenues in order to raise sufficient funds for the purpose.

It conveys my heartfelt gratitude to our respected Principal, Dr. Rema Chhakchhuak for his endless support in all the department activities and I give a big shout out to my dear dedicated colleagues who always give their very best effort in imparting education to our students and in taking up the responsibilities as a department.

The Department of Commerce was incorporated in HATIM since the inception of the institute in the year 2007. During the twelve successful years of its functioning, by the grace of God the Department is blessed with qualified and committed teachers and has produced quite a number of graduates who stood up to the top ten positions in the Mizoram University examinations.

### **Faculty**

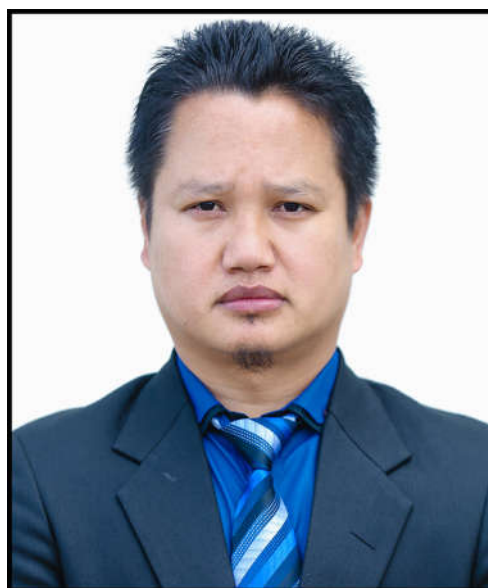
### **Entrepreneurship Knowledge Cell**

Mizoram is a late starter in the field of professional Social Work practices and services. Professional Social work education was just started in Master degree level with the establishment of Mizoram University in 2000-2001 academic sessions. About ten years later, for the very first time in the history of Mizoram, the Baptist Church of Mizoram (BCM) with a vision of better society where it's citizens are encouraged, motivated and sensitized dignity and worth of the people, the first batch of Bachelor of Social work was started in HATIM in the year 2010 as a pioneer institution offering Bachelor Degree level in Professional Social Work education in Mizoram, southern part of Mizoram, Lunglei in particular.

The Government of India realized the importance of professional Social Work service to bring about social harmony and promoting social work education throughout the country. It is interesting fact to report that since the inception of Professional Social Work Education in HATIM in 2010, almost all the community of Lunglei town is being studied by our students as part of their field practicum and provided the community their Social Mapping, Resources Map, Time-Line etc. As one of the results of the existence of Department of Social Work education here in Lunglei, person with a problem are approached and rendered help to manage with their problems, resources available as well as provision of solutions strategies through research based findings. The department is imparting not only education, but also gives effort to encourage the students to render services to the community and the society where they belong. In addition to that point, the Department in collaboration with CBOs, NGOs, Government agencies and community leaders, working towards the betterment of the society.

The Department deems it important practical (Viz, Field work, Seminar presentation, seminar attendance, Report writing, GC/IC, Observation, exposers, Think & Write, Discussion, Group and Individual Presentation etc.) based learning education system that is lacking of in the present system and pattern of learning in educational institution in Mizoram. Thus, in order to bring about quality education, the department is trying its best in imparting not only knowledge based education but skills based education to the students through various teaching methods.

### Departments' Activities:

The Department has number of activities in every academic year, in this current session too, Department engaged in various programs and activities. The following are the major and important activities.

### **1. PRA Exercise on Medicinal Plantation:**

It was originally one of the activities of Forest Department, DFO Lunglei District. The department (BSW 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester), in collaboration with District Forest Office conducted Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) exercise on the month of August, 2018 In selected villages such as Thualthu, Mausen, Zotlang, Thiltlang and, S. Vanlaiphai with the help of their respective R.O's along with the teachers. Students were selected based on their Field Work Practical performances and categorized into three groups headed by the teachers; the Forest Department bearded all the expense and Rs. 25000/- is given to the Social Work Department as remuneration, which was used to conduct Rural Camp at South Phaileng, Lunglei District.

**2. Rural Camp:** This is our usual practice to organize Rural Camp for the 3<sup>Rd</sup> Semester for every batch for 10 days. Students learn to work with community leaders understanding the socio-economic and political administration of community. Moreover, students expose themselves to rural life. For this session, it was fall on 3<sup>rd</sup> September to 9<sup>th</sup> September, 2018. South Phaileng village was opted by the students and the event was a grand success, with active participation from various NGO's and community people participation in every activity.

**3. Observation Visits:** As per regulations of the University, Observation visit was organized for the fresh students in the beginning of the first Semester within the town. The main aim is to expose the students to the setting and system of the Government and Non-governmental organizations offices and agencies. By this session, Sub- Head Quarters YMA, MHIP, Grace Society, BCM main Office, BCO and Khawiva Power Plan. Students as well as the offices appreciated the Visitation and good rapport has been built.

**4. Block Placement for 5<sup>th</sup> Semester:** Mandatorily it is organize for every 5<sup>th</sup> semester student as part of field practicum and expose themselves to the agency of their choice in outside of Lunglei District. This time, it was organized during 25<sup>th</sup> January to 17<sup>th</sup> February 2019; all the students went outside of Mizoram viz, Shillong, Kolkatta, Darjeeling. It is also good to report that the student had good experiences so far that they never experienced in Mizoram.

**5. Individual and Group Counseling:** This also mandatory duty for all the Supervisors to call the students for Group or Individual counseling which may also be called as mentoring system, a group of students were assigned under the guidance of each faculty for guidance and supervision in regards to field practicum. Each student maintain report file which is to be submitted weekly to their mentor. The Department deemed it necessary and important Counseling class, in which student is given guidance on anything about field-work and its related issue. This

usually effectively held in helping the students get out of their confusion in regards to academic as well as personal issues.

**6. Publication- Research, Project work, Article etc:** The Department encouraged fifth semester students to publish their research work/findings in any of the official journals. Moreover, to encourage the students, the Department also decided to add five marks to student who write article and flash in the newspaper or bulletin.

**7. Fieldwork:** Field Work is an integral part of our subject and this year too our students were trained by the faculty in various aspects of field settings around Lunglei town. It is mandatory as per Department of Social Work, Mizoram University to conduct Fieldwork for all the students for not less than 11 visit to their respective agencies/Community etc. Usually, First semester are placed in NGO's setting to study programs and services of the agency and when they become II semester they are assign to conduct Case-Study of at least 3 cases in their respective agencies. The III Semester students are sent to Government setting (Offices) to study Government programmes after that they are then sent to Community Setting in their IV semester practical field work where they conduct Survey, Community profiling, exercise PRA and so on. The V Semester students therefore, required to conduct mini-research on the topic of their choice based on their respective communities under the guidance of respective supervisors.

**8. Seminar:** Seminar is conducted at the end of every Semester as part of University exam, which cannot be skipped by anyone of the students. It is an Individual effort that the students prepare seminar papers based on their field work practicum and presented as part of practical exams. It is mandatory as per University regulations failing which, result would be treated as withheld. It is indeed a platform for the students to express their knowledge and improve skills, public and audience address, as well as it gives chances to improve and growth in personality.

**9. Charity:** The students not only study but also participate in charity. The students contribute some amount of money from scholarship and other source every year. Any NGOs and Rehabilitation Centre is selected and help them according to their needs. This year the II Semester students have donated sum amount of money (Rs.9,500/-) and projected to donate Table Tennis Board to District Jail, Lunglei. In addition, Rs. 20 only is collected from the students every month and Rupee Rs.100 is collected from the department teachers for department Fund, which is usually use for departmental/internal expenses such as remuneration for Guest speaker, departmental extra activities like Nature Walk, special occasion, Rural Camp, seminar etc.

**10. World Social Work Day:** For the very first time in the southern part of Mizoram, in 2013 the department started to observe “**World Social Work Day**” which is usually falls on third Tuesday of March every year, since then it has been observing every year along with some of the delegates and special invitees from Community leaders, Community based Organization, Government and Non-governmental Organizations. As usual, this year also the department successfully observed World Social Work Day on 19<sup>th</sup> of March along with Pu. Lalduhawma Pachuau Chief Organizer Lunglei Thalai Pawl (MTP) as a chief Guest. About 50 special invitees from various agencies joined us and participated in open discussion over the theme “**Promoting the Importance of Human Relationships**”.

**11. Social Service:** It is one of the important activities that the department regularly engaged in Social services. In this academic session, the department sent students as a volunteer in various activities such as NSS Programme, Clean Nghasih Lui organized by Deputy Commissioner, Anti-Tobacco programme, Marathon, social service like cleaning college premises and surrounding etc. The department sometimes conducts Survey, need assessment etc, as part of field practicum in the community where students are placed and the results or findings are use for future reference.

**10. Achievement:** The department has various achievements since its inception; there have been number of students who qualified for Master Degree course in Prestigious Social work Institutions throughout the country including TISS a Premier Social Work Institution not only in India but also in Asian countries. In this on- going session also there are 4 students who got through test and qualified for MSW programme at TISS Mumbai and Guwahati Campus.

We are also proud to report that there are 3 Alumni who run NGOs of their owned viz, Old age home and Child Care Centre in Lunglei, Youth Centre in Hnahthial town. Regarding the strength and qualification of faculty of the Department, It is interesting fact to mention that all the faculty members are qualified for MSW first class, NET, M.Phil and one teacher is awarded Doctoral Degree in 2016 while other teachers are on the process.

Finally, I would like to thank all those students who, with their enthusiasm and energy have contributed to the activities of our Department and all the faculty members for their endless support to uphold our academic standard. I also, on behalf of the Department would like to extent sincere gratitude to all the Admin-staffs and Residence Guides for their extra-care and understanding to the smooth functioning of the department, field practicum in particular.

### English Drive:

With English being the community language of HATIM and HATIM itself being an institution which strongly emphasizes on the development of communicative and language skills in the said language, the Department of English plays an important role in developing programs in creating an environment for English language learning and Communicative skills. The department undertakes the English Drive where the usage and fluency of the community language is endeavored by presentation of grammar, common mistakes, vocabulary, idioms and phrases as well as pronunciation/phonology. During the English Drive, students and teachers of the Department take a platform after the Morning Devotions to conduct a brief presentation under the supervision of A Faculty Drive-Coordinator. One month is dedicated in each Semester for this English Drive.

### HATIM English Proficiency Certificate Course (HEPCC):

HATIM, though an English Speaking Community, also opens its doors for students who lacks communication skills in the language. In order to provide an environment for the students to learn and practice the language, since 2015, a compulsory add-on course 'Functional English' has been introduced for every 1<sup>st</sup> year student. This add-on course functions under the Department of English with classes being held once every week for one semester of the first year students. In this course students learn to interact with basic communication skills with the help of role play and practice sessions.

In 2018, the Department saw the room for improvement with the add-on course. With the guidance of the Principal, Dr. Rema Chhakchhuak and the approval of the Council Body, the add-on Course has been upgraded to a Certificate Course named 'HATIM English Proficiency Certificate Course'. Under this Course, students who have attended the Functional English course during their 1<sup>st</sup> year will undertake an assessment after which they can graduate with a graded certificate. The graduating batch of 2019 will be the first batch of students who will graduate with this certificate.

### **HILLFEST- DEPARTMENTAL EVENT:**

As part of the extra-curricular activity initiated by the Department, during the years 2015 and 2016, the Festival of Arts has been organized by the Department to 'celebrate the arts'. This was a one day programme where students were given the platform to display their artistic abilities in literature, music, fine arts, handicrafts and also theatrical presentation.

Akin to the spirit of the Festival of Arts, the institution organized a Youth Festival – HILLFEST 2019 which is open to all, during 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> March 2019. During the Festival, each department of the Institution is given a platform to showcase the essence of the department. The department took this opportunity to highlight the creative spirit of the department by staging a costume parade – 'Through the Ages: Famous personalities of the English Literary Periods'. The Department of English was, in fact, the only department with a showcase which has student participation.

Last, but not the least, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the principal for his utmost and enthusiastic support of all the departmental programs and initiatives. My esteemed colleagues are to be given paramount gratitude for their team work, their support, their dedication and their unbeaten spirit without which the Department is nothing but a name.

Library is considered to be the heart of the Institution, while serving approximately 200 users daily, we are honored to participate in the creation of an effective learning environment for our students, faculty and staff. Our goal is to make sure that we continue to meet the need of our students, faculty and staff of our college as we go forward. We ensure that the library continues to grow to the changing need of our users and still our aim is to provide a modern, efficient and welcoming library service for all members of the college. One of the most significant and remarkable event during this academic session is shifting the library to our permanent campus at Kawmzawl, Pukpui along with three departments namely Social Work, English and Commerce Department. Initially this is a big challenge in terms of library staff, transportation, building and internet connectivity, eventually the library has to be separated into two since the Computer Science department remain in the Town Campus Lunglei, look after by the Assistant Librarian and one Library attendant. Permanent Campus Kawmzawl Library look after by the Librarian and one library attendant.

Our Library is working on the process of Computerized based services and is in the initial stage of library automation and the library software SOUL is being running since 2014. Software for Universities Libraries (SOUL) is a state-of-the-art integrated library management software designed and developed by INFLIBNET center based on requirement of College and University libraries. It is a user-friendly software developed to work under client server environment. The first version of software i.e. SOUL 1.0 Was released during CALIBER 2000. The database of SOUL 1.0 was designed on MS SQL and was compatible with MS

SQL server 7.0 or higher. The latest version of the SOUL software is 2.0 has been designed for latest versions of MS SQL and MySQL. Our Institution also use the latest version of SOUL2.0 as a major feature and functionalities of the Library.

### **Circulation Service**

Automated circulation system using barcode technology has been used since March, 2014 which provides easy and prompt service to the users. The main characteristic and nature of circulation service are charging and discharging of books. This Circulation Desk Service is the main user's service point, its main function is lending materials to library users, checking in materials return, Monitoring materials for damage and routing them to the appropriate staff for repair or replacement etc. In this service students can borrow 5 books at a time for 15 days and a fine is imposed for late submission of books at Rs 2 per books per day. Faculty are given a privilege to borrow 10 books at a time for 30 days, a fine of overdue is imposed same as with students. Approximately number of books issued everyday are 45-50. An average of 80 to 120 users per day makes use of this service.

### **Reprographics Service**

Today, reprographic service plays vital and important role in the transmission of knowledge in the library resources and services. Photocopying of the information is the main work of the reprographic unit. Photocopying, printing and scanning facilities are available in the library. Photocopy and printing charges are taken from the students, staff, and faculty at a subsidized rate.

### **Student Orientation Program**

Student orientation program is one of the activities that we have every year and this is a must for newly admitted students to get to know more about the library rules and regulation, to familiarize the users with the environment of the library. The members of the library should get themselves acquainted with the environment, its collection and their physical location, the tools that provide access to the collection and to the types of services offered by the library.

### **Reference Service**

Library reference service is also one of the significance services in our library. Reference collection like Books and student project works are made available for reference only and we have little collection that contain useful facts and information, such as Dictionaries, Encyclopedia Britannica, Year Book etc.

### **Special collection**

This new academic session we have newly introduced special collection, in which some specialized documents are collected for the students that they could venture out in the outside world for sharpening and shaping themselves and engaged in competitive world in which we have collected latest current affairs, difference subject material for UPSC, MPSC and Bank POs examinations etc.

### **Stock verification**

Stock Verification in many libraries is an annual process. In stock verification we can verify the availability of books on the shelves. Every Book has a details classification on the shelves where it belongs. Student can easily search through web OPAC which can help easy and fast to perform search on any from any of the listed. If the Users wants to filter the results by any specific type of material by choosing the corresponding option "filter by type of material.

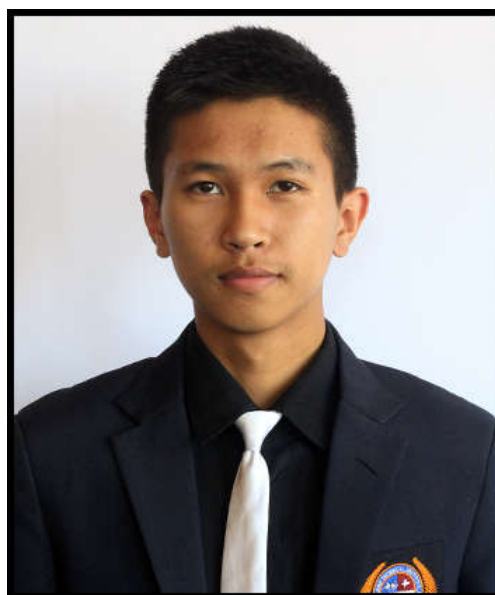

## **MAIN ACTIVITIES FROM JULY 2018 TILL DATE (MARCH 2019)**

### **1. Conducting regular Sunday Worship Service**

It was hosted by Govt. Zirtiri Residential Science College, Aizawl. The training took place during 4<sup>th</sup> -8<sup>th</sup> December 2018; sister Gracy Lalrinfeli Fanai from our unit was selected as the Best Camper (Female). This was the third time the HEW participated in the Leadership Training Camp.

### **9. Conducting fellowship and prayer meeting**

The Evangelical Wing had taken the initiative steps to enrich and nourish the spiritual life of the students. So, the HEW has been organizing a fellowship and a prayer meeting for the first time in the community. It was conducted once every week since February 2019. #### **MAIN EVENTS**

This festival marked its significant entry as the first time a college have organized such an event in Mizoram. The venue of the festival is at the Permanent Campus of HATIM at Kawmzawl, Pukpui, Lunglei. The festival lasts for two days, i.e, on the 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> of March, 2019. The main events during the festival are briefly reported below.

#### **First Day : 15<sup>th</sup> March, 2019 (9:30AM – 6:00PM)**

The festival was inaugurated by Rev. F. Ramdinmawia, General Secretary, Baptist Church of Mizoram, who was the Chief Guest for the first day. Rev. Zohmingliana AGS i/c Service BCM laid the foundation stone for the College Academic Block-C after the inaugural ribbon cutting by the Chief Guest.

**Red carpet event:** This event takes place after the inaugural ribbon cutting. It includes the introduction/interviews of Invited Guests and for the introduction of various stalls and activities, interviews of general public and announcements. The whole event which includes the red carpet and the main stage events were hosted by Mr. T. Lalrinmuana, Miss Laldinkimi Khiangte and Miss Janet Lawmsangzuali.

The Red Carpet event was followed by visitation of various stalls, devotions by the AGS i/c Service BCM, keynote address by the Principal Dr. Rema Chhakchhuak and speech by the Chief Guest.

**Departmental Event:** This is a showcase of the indigeneity and department specific event or programme. Mr. K. Lalmuanpuia, HOD, Department of Computer Sciences and Mr. R. Lalnunthara, faculty, Department of Commerce used this platform to introduce their departments and gave a report of the various activities, courses and success stories.

**Talent Hunt (The Hills got Talent):** This is a competition of different talents from various clubs or individuals. The talent hunt includes all performances except musical vocal items and is open for all. Prizes are made for the best talent shows. There are seven participants / talents in this event from the college students and various localities within

Lunglei Town. The items vary from on-the-spot painting and creative choreography performances.

**Original Film Festival:** One of the main event in this festival is **Original Film Festival** where entries are open for a Short Film Competition. The Chief Judge of this event will be Mapuia of Leitlang Pictures, one of the most renowned figure in the field of Videography in Mizoram. The items were made available for sale/auction by the end of the Festival.

**Stalls:** Various stalls and other counters were opened and managed by different interest clubs and interested vendors. A total of 23 stalls were open to the public out of which 5 stalls were rented by vendors outside the college community. Stall owners have shown their creative work and achievements in their stalls and their products were available for sale.

Mr. Andrew Lalhruaia, District Urban Development Officer (DUDO), UD&PA Lunglei was the Chief Guest on second day of the festival. The chief guest inaugurated the Solid Waste Management Plant for the college. The visitation of the various stalls by the invitees / guests took place after the inauguration which is followed by a speech by the Chief Guest.

**Departmental Event:** The Department of English showcased a very interesting character play of renowned personalities in the field of Arts and Literature which is conducted by Mrs. HT Zuali, HOD. This event is followed by a departmental introduction and report by Mr. Rosangliana Kiangte, HOD Department of Social Work.

**Music / Band competition:** A Music / Band competition was organized for youths to showcase their talent and creativity in music. The competition was divided into two sessions. Participants from the college's Music Club and from various localities in and outside Lunglei Town signed up for this event.

**First Session: Solo Competition**

There was a total of 12 participants in this competition. Each participant was



allowed to perform one song (English or Mizo). The competition was held in the forenoon and a lot of gifted youths revealed and show their talents in this competition.

**Open Air Concert:** After the festival was concluded, an open air concert was held in which the top three bands performed. The cheer and dancing marks the ending of a great festival which sparks a light in the hearts of people which will continue to burn in the coming years.

### **CONCLUDING REMARKS**

On record, the festival was attended by 963 people from outside the college. This record is just an approximate count from the reception counter which is sure to be a lot higher. One of the stalls crossed 1lakh in sales during the two-day festival which proves the number of attendances is high. Another significant remark is that the campus is completely smoke, alcohol and drug free during the festival. People from

outside respect the campus and this resulted in creating a safe atmosphere even for small children to enjoy the festival. This is the reason many people spent the festival as a quality time for the whole family. The festival proves that youths crave for a platform to show their creativity and if youths are engaged positively, when they are busy doing what they are most interested, there is no time to misuse and time is spent productively.
