I thank God, the Almighty for enabling me to write brief reports about the institution's achievements during the recent years.

We had not been able to publish DOKIMOS in the last two years due to inconveniences caused by the Covid-19 pandemic, in fact, all other academics and non-academic activities have also been hampered in one way or another. Nevertheless, various other options and tools were imposed whenever and wherever suitable to ensure that the academic career of the students' developmental works relating to the institute do not get halted. My reports include mainly academic and some co-curricular activities and infrastructural development on the campus.

A. GENERAL REPORTS:

1. Beginning of Day Scholars Programme: For the first time in the history of the institute, admissions were opened for day scholars (non - hostellers) in the academic session 2020-2021. This helped make it possible for us to increase our intake capacity.

2. Complete shifting of the Institute into the campus: All the academic departments and moveable assets have completely been moved into the permanent campus at Kawmzawl, Pukpui from the previous location at Chanmari, Lunglei in the month of January 2021.

- 2. Online Teaching / Learning Management System:** As stated above, the Covid-19 pandemic had forced us to switch over to online mode of teaching/ learning process from traditional offline mode. Most of the teaching activities had to be carried out on internet platforms. In order to see the smooth functioning of the teaching and learning process, the institute adopted the use of a web-based learning management system namely Moodle platform since July, 2020. We are glad to be one of the few colleges in the state to be able to implement this system.
- 3. Online Seminars and Meetings:** A number of webinars were conducted both for students and faculty using platforms like Zoom, Google Meet and Webex. Various departmental meetings and webinars have also been conducted through online conference.
- 4. Examinations:** Most of the internal and university examinations have been carried on blended mode where various online social media platforms were made use of besides Moodle.

5. Incorporation of new subjects and establishment of new academic departments: The year 2020 set for us new milestone in the way that History and Philosophy subjects were upgraded to full-fledged departments. Besides these two more new subjects, namely Psychology and Education were incorporated this same year. Due to these new developments our intake capacity could also be doubled up.

C. EXTRA AND CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:

- 1. Valedictory Ceremonies:** The 10th Valedictory Ceremony was conducted successfully on 31st May, 2019 for the first time on the permanent campus where Dr. R. Lalthangliana, Cabinet Minister incharge of Higher and Technical Education Department, Govt. of Mizoram graced the occasion as the Chief Guest. However, the Valedictory services could not be held in the years 2020 and 2021 due to restriction from the State Government.
- 2. Parents-Teachers' Meet:** Parents-Teachers' Meet was organised successfully on 29th July, 2019. However, over our usual practice of conducting Parents-Teachers' Meet could not be held the usual way during the years 2020 and 2021 due to government restrictions. Nevertheless, online meetings of parents and staffs of the institute were held three times during these years through Google Meet platform.
- 3. Online Admissions and Payments of Fees:** Pertaining to the Covid-19 related restrictions, online admission for students and online payment of fees were introduced in the year 2020 for the first time in the history of the institute and is still in continuation. This makes an important landmark for the institute.
- 4. Observation of Green Mizoram Day:** Green Mizoram Day 2021 was observed on our campus at the District level on 11th June, 2021 where Mr. Lawmawma Tochwawng, MCA & Vice Chairman HPC, Lunglei graced the occasion as the Chief Guest. Officers from various departments had planted trees on this day.

5. Other activities and events: All other activities such as Spiritual Nurturing Programmes, Teachers' Day celebration, Freshers' Social, etc. were held mostly using various conference platforms through video conferencing.

D. INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT:

The Institute had partially begun starting academic programmes besides regular classes on the permanent campus since March 2019. However, most of the basic facilities needed to run full fledged on campus academic programmes were not yet available initially. Hence, many new projects had to be started right in the following months and years. Therefore, I would like to report infrastructural development that had taken place during the period from April 2019 to March 2022.

- 1. Completion of Auditorium:** The only auditorium used as multipurpose hall was fully completed and furnished internally by August 2019.
- 2. Temporary Classrooms:** Since there were no academic buildings initially, some portions of the Administrative block were turned into make shift classrooms wherein only three departments could fit. One department has to still function on the previous campus for the whole academic session.
- 3. Widening and Pavement of Campus internal roads:** Widening surface levelling and blacktopping of existing internal roads on the campus was completed along with construction of proper drainage system in December 2019.
- 4. Follow up on Master Plan for the campus:**
 - (i) Ground work/ earth work for the Gents' Residents site was completed in July 2020.
 - (ii) Ground levelling of the site for Academic Administrative Area and that of the Multipurpose Hall site was completed in January 2021.
 - (iii) Works on construction of new internal roads on the campus and pavement and blacktopping of the new roads was completed in February 2021.

5. Academic Buildings:

(i) BLOCK 'A'

Construction of temporary classroom buildings was completed in March 2021 at the Academic Block 'A' site. This building hosts 10 classrooms, 1 faculty common room and separate toilets for Ladies and Gents. This work make it possible to completely move the remaining departments and classes with the permanent campus.

(ii) BLOCK 'C'

Work on construction of Academic Block 'C' , the estimated amount of which is Rs. 8.8 crores, had begun in April 2021. The construction is still underway and the finish floors could be occupied from May 2022.

6. Parking Lots and Campus Fence: Spaces for vehicles parking are made according to the master plan and permanent fencing work on the campus boundaries have also been partially completed.

7. Electrification of the Campus: Light transmission lines are extended to cover up the occupied areas of the campus by installing 17 new poles and upgrading the transformer to a larger capacity.

8. Renovation and Re-organization of existing Gents' Residence: The existing Gents' Residence has been renovated and reorganized to make it more disaster-friendly while allowing more privacy to residents, during December, 2021 – January 2022.

9. Other buildings:

- (i) Painting works of Ladies' Residence was completed on December, 2021 along with partial completion of building extension.
- (ii) New Cafeteria building was constructed and completed in April, 2021.
- (iii) Students' centre was fully completed and electrification done in November, 2021.

(iv) Construction of the first in-campus maintenance staff quarters was completed on February, 2022.

10. Works done by DRDA, Lunglei: Following the request we have made to the District Rural Development Agency (DRDA), Lunglei District, has constructed various needed structures on the campus, which indeed is very valuable for the institute.

The department's works on the campus include two rainwater harvesting tanks with capacity of 1,14,000 litres each; an eighty metres long paved pathway (steps); retaining walls and concrete bridge.

11. Internet facility on the campus: Realising the need of a higher educational institute in today's IT world, attempt to make the permanent campus with accessible free WI-FI for students and staff had been made since regular academic programmes began on the campus. After steps of constructions with various service providers, we could finally acquire Jio internet leased line, Guwahati. The campus has been covered with internet WIFI since April, 2020.

12. Installation of CCTV on the campus: New closed -circuit television system including 16 surveillance Cameras were installed on the vital areas of the campus both outdoors and indoors in August, 2020. Steps are taken to increase the number of installation of cameras for the residences(hostel)building shortly. The campus is now under 24 hours video surveillance, which is an important tool of deterrent for untoward actions and behaviour.

13. Sports facilities: The institute deems it important to provide facilities for various sports disciplines on the campus. However, only some facilities could be provided so far at the present and we look forward to regular upgradation of existing facilities in the future.

(i) A few new items for gymnasium in both Residences were acquired during 2020-2021.

- (ii) New sports items and tools like table tennis board, rackets, volleyball, basketball, football etc have been acquired at a regular interval and on the basis of need.
- (iii) A new permanent outdoor basketball court is being constructed on the campus beside the existing volleyball court and football playground.

Finally, the institute strikes to universalise itself for all the stakeholder through thick and thin by ever extending its mission directions to bring about excellence and earnest commitment. It will ever be seeking to nurture young minds and provide holistic development through various teaching delivered through various modes. It holds on to principles of seeking, sharing, and serving to provide young students lifelong learning, teaching with examples integrity and accountability!

What is the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)?

In pursuance of its Action Plan for performance evaluation, assessment and accreditation and quality up-gradation of institutions of higher education, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore proposes that every accredited institution should establish an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a quality sustenance measure. Since quality enhancement is a continuous process, the IQAC will become a part of the institution's system and work towards realisation of the goals of quality enhancement and sustenance. The prime task of the IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the overall performance of institutions.

Why is NAAC Accreditation Important?

The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) conducts assessment and accreditation of Higher Educational Institutions (HEI) such as colleges, universities or other recognised institutions to derive an understanding of the 'Quality Status' of the institution. NAAC evaluates the institutions for its conformance to the standards of quality in terms of its performance related to the educational processes and outcomes, curriculum coverage, teaching-learning processes, faculty, research, infrastructure, learning resources, organisation, governance, financial well-being and student services. Its main objective is to make quality the defining element of higher education in India through a

combination of self and external quality evaluation, promotion and sustenance initiatives.

Education plays a vital role in the development of any nation. Therefore, there is a premium on both quantity (increased access) and quality (relevance and excellence of academic programmes offered) of higher education. The NAAC has been set up to facilitate the volunteering institutions to assess their performance vis-a-vis set parameters through introspection and a process that provides space for participation of the institution.

Benefits of Accreditation

- Institution to know its strengths, weaknesses, and opportunities through an informed review process
- Identification of internal areas of planning and resource allocation
- Collegiality on the campus
- Funding agencies look for objective data for performance funding
- Institutions to initiate innovative and modern methods of pedagogy
- New sense of direction and identity for institutions
- The society look for reliable information on quality education offered
- Employers look for reliable information on the quality of education offered to the prospective recruits
- Intra and inter-institutional interactions

What happens if an institution is not accredited?

- Attending an unaccredited program can mean that students studying in a non-accredited institution or University will not be able to transfer credits to another school, and will not be able to obtain appropriate professional licensure in their respective field of study.
- According to Prof Mughesappa, Joint Director of Collegiate Education Department has stated that colleges may lose their licence over lack of NAAC Accreditation.
- While applying for higher studies either in India or abroad, colleges often look at the grading of a college to gain a better understanding of a student's performance as a student relative to their peer group. The higher the accreditation, the better it increases the chances for a favourable reply or admission.

The visions and roles of IQAC are

- To develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvements, quality and performance
- To make a significant and meaningful contribution towards academic excellence
- To usher in quality by working out intervention strategies to enhance performance
- To optimize and integrate modern methods of teaching and learning
- To disseminate information on quality parameters and share research with other institutions

In another words, the primary role of IQAC is to promote measures for institutional functioning towards quality enhancement through internalization of quality culture and institutionalization of best practices. Quality assurance is a by-product of on-going efforts to define the objectives of an institution, to have a work plan to achieve them and to specify the checks and balances to evaluate the degree to which each of the tasks is fulfilled. Hence devotion and commitment to improvement rather than mere institutional control is the basis for devising procedures and instruments for assuring quality. The right balance between the health and growth of an institution needs to be struck. The IQAC has to ensure that whatever is done in the institution for “education” is done efficiently and effectively with high standards.

Quality assurance and enhancement being an on-going campaign, the IQAC of the college organizes workshops and seminars on quality related themes and the various programs of the college have been documented in the form of a self-study report.

The IQAC is currently poised and preparing to welcome an expert team to assess and accredit the institution, for its very first cycle of accreditation under the auspices of the national assessment and accreditation council (NAAC), a statutory body of the University Grants Commission (UGC).

Strategies

IQAC shall evolve mechanisms and procedures for:

- a) Ensuring timely, efficient and progressive performance of academic, administrative and financial tasks;
- b) Relevant and quality academic/ research programmes;
- c) Equitable access to and affordability of academic programmes for various sections of society;
- d) Optimization and integration of modern methods of teaching and learning;
- e) The credibility of assessment and evaluation process;
- f) Ensuring the adequacy, maintenance and proper allocation of support structure and services;
- g) Sharing of research findings and networking with other institutions in India and abroad.

Functions

Some of the functions expected of the IQAC are:

- a) Development and application of quality benchmarks;
- b) Parameters for various academic and administrative activities of the institution;
- c) Facilitating the creation of a learner-centric environment conducive to quality education and faculty maturation to adopt the required knowledge and technology for participatory teaching and learning process;
- d) Collection and analysis of feedback from all stakeholders on quality-related institutional processes;
- e) Dissemination of information on various quality parameters to all stakeholders;
- f) Organization of inter and intra institutional workshops, seminars on quality related themes and promotion of quality circles;
- g) Documentation of the various programmes/activities leading to quality improvement;

- h) Acting as a nodal agency of the Institution for coordinating quality-related activities, including adoption and dissemination of best practices;
- i) Periodical conduct of Academic and Administrative Audit and its follow-up
- j) Preparation and submission of the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) as per guidelines and parameters of NAAC.

Benefits

IQAC will facilitate / contribute to:

- a) Ensure clarity and focus in institutional functioning towards quality enhancement;
- b) Ensure internalization of the quality culture;
- c) Ensure enhancement and coordination among various activities of the institution and institutionalize all good practices;
- d) Provide a sound basis for decision-making to improve institutional functioning;

The operational features and functions discussed above are broad-based to facilitate institutions towards academic excellence and the institutions can and may adapt them to their specific needs, following the UGC-NAAC guidelines.

I. IQAC in HATIM

The IQAC was established in HATIM in the year 2013 as a mechanism to build and ensure a quality culture at the institutional level. Since its inception, IQAC has become a part of the college and has been working as the coordinating body among all the stakeholders of the institution towards realizing the goal of quality enhancement and sustenance. Since its inception in 2007, HATIM grew from two departments to 8 departments within 15 years.

- 4) HANDS ON TRAINING ON LMS-MOODLE:** The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of our College in collaboration with Department of Computer Science, organised *Hands on training on Learning Management System (LMS) Moodle* for all teaching staff from 7th – 9th September, 2020. As Computer Science Department is the only technical-related department in the college, they took initiative for the success of this training programme. The resource persons are Mr. H.Lalruatkima, Asst. Professor, Department of Computer Science and Mr. Vanlalnghaka Hnamte, Computer Lab. Assistant. The college have developed an online platform based on Moodle LMS which is the mode of Online Teaching for the Semester during Covid-19 pandemic. LMS Moodle was used as the main online teaching platform from 14th Sept, 2020 till date. It can also be integrated with Zoom Cloud Meeting, Google Classroom, Google Meet, YouTube, etc.
- 5) PARENTS-TEACHERS MEETING (Online):** It was successfully organised by the Department of Computer Science, HATIM, on 1st September, 2021 (Wednesday) @ 7:30 PM via Google Meet. The programme was led by H. Lalruatkima, Asst. Prof, Deptt. of Computer Science. Welcome Address & Short Speech was delivered by V.Vuansanga, Principal, HATIM. Presentation on Department Report and Important Information for the Parents was given by K.Lalmuanpuia, Head, Department of Computer Science. The resource person was Vanlalpeka, TU Dortmund University, North Rhine-Westphalia, Germany. He completed his MS (Information Systems Management) from Carnegie Mellon University, Pittsburgh, USA and now studying MS (Data Science) from TU Dortmund University, North Rhine-Westphalia, Germany. The Programme was led by Dr. C Lalnuntluanga, President, MITS. Mr. H. Lalrinawma, Asst. Professor, HATIM introduced the speaker/resource person and the webinar get started. Bachelor of Social Work course (BSW) was started in HATIM in the year 2010. To be the first college offering BSW course in Mizoram, the department was started under the umbrella of department of Social work Mizoram University, the course was initiated by the pioneer teachers Dr. C. Lalenzama and Madam C. Lalremtluangi. Since its inception, the Department took active part in assessing the issues of the community relating to socio-economic, studying government schemes and programmes, co-coordinating with NGOs and various agencies as part of curriculum and co-curriculum activities.

Being a pioneer college offering BSW course in the state, the department plays a leading role in all aspects of academic development in southern part of Mizoram in particular. Since its inception, the department has produced a number of students who excel in theory and practical settings, many of our students pursue further studies in prestigious universities across the country and it is interesting to report for the department that a significant number of our Alumni also run NGO/agency of their own.

Although, the department is very young, it has succeeded a number of remarkable milestones in social work education in Mizoram. The department of social work plays a crucial role in promoting social work education throughout the state. Due to outbreak of Covid-19 pandemic and lockdown imposed by the state government the college has been shut down which also compelled the department to minimize the activities. However, the department put its best efforts to continue academic programme in online mode to complete the syllabi by using various tools of teaching and learning.

Departmental Activities:

- I. Orientation:** The department usually makes use of the first two/three days as orientation programme. The orientation is more than mere introduction it was designed to orient our students to get acquainted for the upcoming academic new session. For this orientation programme the department has assigned the teacher in-charge to each semester with specific topics where students were given an overview of curriculum and co-curriculum activities as well as rules and regulation related to field work practicum.

- II. Rural Camp:** Rural Camp for the 3rd Semester in this year was held from 9th Sept to 16th September, 2019 at Zotuitlang village. Zotuitlang is located towards the northern part of Lunglei district; it is about 30 kms away from Lunglei. Students learnt to work with community leaders to understand the socio-economic and political administration of the community.

- III. Observation Visit:** Observation visit is mandatory for the fresh students to get acquainted with practical setting before the start of academic session. Students have to go at least three days visit to different setting within the town area. For this session, Sub- Head Quarters YMA, MHIP, Grace Society, BCM main Office, BCO and Wadha Centre were selected for the purpose of observation visit.

- IV. Block Placement:** Mandatorily it is organized for every 5th semester student as part of field practicum and expose themselves to the agency of their choice in outside of Lunglei District. This time, it was organized during 28th January to 14th February 2020. Total number of 20 students were placed in various settings in different districts such as District Child Protection Unit Champhai, CodNerc Aizawl, Blind School Kolasib, District Child Protection Unit Siaha, LiFCoDe Aizawl, Dept. of Psychiatry Civil Hospital Serchhip and District Child Protection Unit Lawngtlai.

V. Semester Wise Practical Fieldwork: Field Work is an integral part of our subject and this year too our students were sent to various practical settings such as Agency, Community, Government agency and block placement. As per syllabus student of BSW has to complete 11 visits in each semester. First semester students are placed in NGO's setting, second semester are assigned to conduct Case-Study III Semester students are sent to Government offices while fourth semester happened to conduct field work practical in the community, the fifth and six semester students are therefore, required to conduct mini-research on the topic of their choice and Block placement respectively.

- 2. Parent-Teacher Meeting:** It is a college usual practice to organize Parent-Teacher meeting in every academic session. Amidst the Covid-19 pandemic, the college has arranged to conduct online (Virtual) Parent-Teacher meeting in department wise, 6th September, 2021 was scheduled for our department. Although it was an online mode, we still had more than 60% of parent's participation rate in the meeting. However, it was a grand success as teachers and parents had a quality time of interaction where the Principal and the admin staffs were also present with us to clarify the queries of the parents.
- 3. MoU with Department of Social Welfare & Tribal Affairs Govt. of Mizoram:** Directorate of Social Welfare, Government of Mizoram and department of Social Work, HATIM signed on Memorandum of Understanding on 24th March, 2021 to collaborate in their endeavor to profile senior citizens for Covid-19 Care package within Lunglei District. For this task, the department assigned all the 5th semester students and under the guidance of Sir R. Lallianzela, students successfully profile the beneficiary list of underprivileged senior citizens and delivered the care package on time. The package consist of eleven items i.e hand wash, hand sanitizer,

masks, soap bars, toned milk, sorazo, nutrela, dal, paracetamol, multi-vitamins and biscuits.

4. World Mental Health Day: The 10th of October, 2021 was World Mental Health Day, the department of Social Work organized Webinar in commemoration of World Mental Health day on the theme of '*Mental Health in an unequal world*'. The event was divided into two sessions where Dr. Grace L. Sailo Asst. Professor Dept. of Social Work Mizoram University and Miss. Julia Vanlalruati Pachuau Guest Faculty Dept. of Clinical Psychology Mizoram University were the resource persons respectively.

5. Field Work Practicum:

(i) *Rural Camp:* Rural camp is mandatory and important component in Bachelor of Social Work. In this academic session, the rural camp was held in Putlungasih Village from 24th February to 1st March, 2021. It is located in the Eastern part in Lunglei district with the total population of 1785, major population is Bru. Putlungasih was established in 1920 and was named after Pasaltha Pu Zatlunga. The department assigned two teachers Miss Rebecca and Sir C. Lalhlimpuia as Supervisor, students were divided into five sub-committees such as transportations, mess, sports, discipline, finance and PRA. The campers carried out several activities which include PRA, survey, hiking, games and sports. These activities had helped them in understanding the village and also helped in building rapport with the village people.

(ii) *Virtual Observation Visits:* Amidst the pandemic, observation visit was organized during 19th July to 23rd July, 2020 for the fresh students in online mode in the beginning of the academic session. The main aim is to expose the students to the setting and system of the Government and Non-governmental organizations offices and agencies. In this session, department arranged with five agencies within Lunglei town to accept our students to conduct observation in online mode such as Full Life Access Trust (FLAT), Project Sunshine, District Child Protection Office, Baptist Church Orphanage and Relief & Development BCM.

(iii) *Block Placement*: Mandatorily it is organized for every 5th semester student in order to accomplish field practicum. Students were divided into six groups and each group were assigned with one faculty member as supervisor and students carried out block placement under the guidance of their respective supervisors. This time, it was organized during 15th February to 26th February 2021 in the selected nine (9) agencies namely Chhawmdawlina In, ICDS Zotlang, TNT Centre Lunglei, ICDS Hnahthial, DCPU Lawngtlai, Hermon Childrens Home Aizawl, Gam Sabha Zonum Aizawl, NYK Lawngtlai and, Mizoram Home Guard HQ Aizawl.

Departmental Activities: This academic session is a very hard session due to pandemic and owing to Covid-19 pandemic all events were conducted in online mode.

- 1. Department Faculty Meeting:** Faculty meeting in our department is as important as making action plan for the upcoming session and also chalks out the solutions to certain obstacles in and outside the academic activities. Faculty meeting is held regularly to ensure all the academic activities are running smoothly, in this academic session we have 12 times faculty meeting so far in virtual platform, the meeting is usually chair by the head of department and keep the record of meeting minutes.
- 2. Orientation:** For a professional course conducting orientation programme is indispensable in every semester. - 3. It was organized in online (virtual) Mode and there were more than 80 participants. The main purpose of this orientation is to sensitize the audience how to response the emerging various issues on AIDS/HIV. 5. World Social Work Day: Webinar in commemoration of World Social Work Day was organized by the Department of Social Work, HATIM, in collaboration with Department of Social Work, ICFAI University, Mizoram and Department of Social Work, Devine Mercy College, Aizawl on 15th of March, 2022 on the theme of "**Co-Building a New Eco-Social World: Leaving No One Behind**". It was successfully held by using Google Meet with 172 participants. Mr R Lallianzela, Asst Professor, presided over the meeting. The Principal of HATIM, Mr Vuansanga Vanchhawng, gave the welcoming remarks. Mrs. C. Lalremtluangi, Assistant Professor, Department of Social Work, offered a key remark in keeping with the theme.

Miss Rebek Lalruatdiki Khiangte, Co-founder Director, Full Life Access Trust/ Ka Thiante In, Lunglei was the resource person. Miss Rebek, being a resource person delivered a message based on the theme by motivating the Social Worker aspirants. To conclude the programme, Dr. Zothankimi Ralte, Assistant Professor and Head, Department of Social Work, ICFAI University, Mizoram, proposed a vote of thanks.

6. Faculty Exchange Programme: The Department of Social Work HATIM and Department of Social Work Divine Mercy College, Aizawl signed Memorandum of understanding for the inter-college Faculty exchange programme on 28th March, 2022. The programme was scheduled between 28th March to 5th April 2022 and was held in the virtual platform.

7. Virtual Observation Visit: Observation Visit is compulsory for every first semester student as per University regulations. In this academic year, the department arranged virtual observation visit on 4th & 5th of October, 2021 for our newly admitted students in different settings such as Baptist Church Orphanage, FLAT (Ka Thiante In), National Helpline for Senior Citizens, Lunglei and BCM Relief & Development, Ramzotlang Serkawn.

8. Block Placement: Block placement is the field work component of the 6th semester students, the department had made the arrangement to conduct block placement in the month of March 2022 (i.e 15th-30th). Students were

divided into six groups and went to different settings of their choice outside of Lunglei town such as Social Guidance Agency Aizawl, Calvary Healing Centre Tripura, DCPO Champhai, Shalom Aizawl, SHADE Lawngtlai, Aizawl Observation Home, Motherless Baby Home Aizawl, Remedy Health Care Aizawl and DCPO Siaha. Students were given guidance and had to submit daily report through WhatsApp/email to their respective guides.

9. Project Work/ Research: Although conducting Mini-research is one of the practical components for the 5th semester, the department re-arranged to conduct individual research work in their 6th semester due to lockdown imposed by the Government. Students simultaneously carried out research work during their block placement.

To conclude the report, I just want to take this opportunity to clarify the myths about Social Work concept and course as part of awareness to the general public that Social work is a practice-based profession (a professional service) in which only trained professional person can render the services. It is also known for its inter-disciplinary course, the syllabi also covering a wide range of politics to psychology, criminology to human development, sociology and welfare of the people, philosophy to human rights, health and mental health, education to social entrepreneurship, counseling to psychotherapy with individuals, families, groups and communities. Social work is all about understanding and striving to improve the lives of people. Special consideration is given to people who are underprivileged group from young people to old aged as well as person struggling with different types of problem in life and help them cope up to improve quality of life. The course focuses more on sound practice rather than theoretical conceptual clarity and the specific contribution which social worker can make to the well-being of the society.

DEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITIES:

1. Seminar and Special Talk:

The Department of English believes in quality education where education is supplemented with co-curricular activities. A departmental seminar is organized every year since 2015 which provided a platform for the students to enhance their academic as well as soft skills. This academic year, however, has seen an improvement in this field as the department organized not just a departmental seminar but also a special talk with an esteemed citizen, Padma Shree RK Lalhluna.

On 25th September, 2019, with Ms. Remruatpui as the convenor for Departmental Seminars and Events, the department held a Seminar on the theme “**North East Writings: Themes and Analysis**” at the Multipurpose Hall, Falkawn Campus. A total of 14 papers were presented by the students, which was followed by a lively discussion.

The next day, on 26th September, 2019, the Department was graced with a Special Talk from an esteemed citizen and Padma Shree awardee for literature, Mr. RK Lalhluna on the topic “**Lengkhawm Zai: Its features and Analysis**”. This talk proved to be a great eye-opener for our students and a lively discussion followed the talk.

2. English Drive:

With English being the community language of HATIM and HATIM itself being an institution which strongly emphasizes on the development of communicative and language skills in the said language, the Department of English plays an important role in developing programs in creating an environment for English language learning and Communicative skills. The department undertakes the English Drive where the usage and fluency of the community language is endeavored by presentation of grammar, common mistakes, vocabulary, idioms and phrases as well as pronunciation/phonology. During the English Drive, students and teachers of the Department take a platform after the Morning Devotions to conduct a brief presentation under the supervision of A Faculty Drive-Coordinator.

For the current Session, Isaac Lalthazuala and Lalremtluangi, the Faculty Drive Coordinators kicked off the English Drive on 5th August 2019. The Drive was carried out through presentations made by 2nd year students during the Community Devotions.

3. HATIM English Proficiency Certificate Course (HEPCC):

HATIM, though an English Speaking Community, also opens its doors for students who lacks communication skills in the language. In order to provide an environment for the students to learn and practice the language, since 2015, a compulsory add-on course ‘Functional English’ has been introduced for every

1st year student. 2018 saw an upgradation of the add on course to a Certificate Course named 'HATIM English Proficiency Certificate Course'.

67 students of the graduating batch of 2019 were awarded with this certificate. However, sadly, due to the pandemic and its novel nature, the graduating batch of 2022 were unable to take the assessment and missed out on acquiring this certificate.

4. Departmental Parents-Teachers Meet:

It has been the usual practice of the Institution to hold a Parents-Teachers Meet on an annual basis. However, in order to have a closer working relationship with the parents of our students and also as important stakeholders, the department with the permission of the Principal held a Parents- Teachers Meet on the 20th September 2019 at HATIM Auditorium, Falkawn Campus. The Department of Psychology was set up in the year 2020. It was first initiated as an elective course; however, the Department conducts a UG program offering Psychology as a core paper and has a temporary affiliation under Mizoram University. The inception of the Psychology Department in HATIM marks a critical milestone as it has become the first college in southern Mizoram to offer Psychology as a core course for undergraduates. Currently, the Department functions with two faculties. It is a three-year degree course comprising 6 semesters and follows the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) syllabus prescribed by Mizoram University.

The Bachelor of Arts in Psychology aims to promote mental health awareness. It also aims to teach its students important life skills and practical knowledge to promote all-round development. It strives to impart knowledge and intends to encourage students to address a variety of issues that are faced by the individual and society. It focuses on implementing ethical behavior in research and practical field and equipping students with an awareness of one's behavior, ways of interacting and influencing others, and their roles in society as responsible individuals.

The course offered has also incorporated practical works that will enrich the students' skills and knowledge in using different psychological tools for assessment. In addition to this, the course has integrated project work that

enhances the students' expertise in conducting any psychological research.

The HATIM Library online repository is created and it was launched in 2021 by the Principal. This is a digital archives created for faculty, staff, researcher and student of an institution. The main objective are to collect, preserve and disseminate digital copies of the intellectual output of the institution. It will also include other digital assets such as administrative documents, course note, technical and annual reports etc. That can be accessible within and outside the college campus.

System Available in the library

Presently there are 10 systems available in the library, 4 systems are for students used for browsing the internet.

Seating Capacity

The library can accommodate 50 seating capacities in the reading room for students and there is 7 seating capacity in the faculty lounge.

Circulation Service

The main characteristic and nature of circulation service are charging and discharging of books. This Circulation Desk Service is the main user's service point, its main function is lending materials to library users, checking in materials returning Monitoring materials for damage and routing them to the appropriate staff for repair or replacement, etc. In this service, students can borrow 5 books at a time for 15 days and a fine is imposed for late submission of books at Rs 2 per book per day. Faculty are given the privilege to borrow 10 books at a time for 30 days, a fine of overdue is imposed same as with students.

Reprographics Service

Today, reprographic service plays a vital and important role in the transmission of knowledge in library resources and services. Photocopying of the information is the main work of the reprographic unit. Photocopying, printing, and scanning facilities are available in the library. Photocopy and printing charges are taken from the students, staff, and faculty at a subsidized rate.

Student Orientation Program

The student orientation program is one of the activities that we have every year and this is a must for newly admitted students to get to know more about the

library rules and regulations, to familiarize the users with the environment of the library. The members of the library should get themselves acquainted with the environment, its collection and their physical location, the tools that provide access to the collection, and the types of services offered by the library.

Reference Service

The library reference service is also one of the significant services in our library. Reference collections like Books and student project works are made available for reference only and we have a little collection that contains useful facts and information, such as Dictionaries, Encyclopedia Britannica, Year Book, etc.

Special collection

In this new academic session, we have a newly introduced special collection, in which some specialized documents are collected for the students that they could venture out into the outside world for sharpening and shape themselves and engaged in the competitive world in which we have collected the latest current affairs, difference subject material for UPSC, MPSC and Bank POs examinations, etc.

It was established as a wing to assist in fulfilling the objectives of the principles on which the foundations of HATIM were laid.

HEW is a wing under HATIM, and not an independent body like other EU units; therefore, all the students of HATIM are HEW members by default and it is mandatory to attend the services. The HATIM Evangelical Wing is one of the most important bodies of the college that takes care of the Worship Services and works for the inspiring and the nourishment of the spiritual life of the community. It has taken up the initiative of the Sunday Afternoon English Service since 17th August 2008 till date.

It was affiliated under the Union of Evangelical Students of India (UESI) in the year 2013. However, there was an active interaction and involvement with the UESI only since 2016, when the HEW leaders attended SLTC camp.

Regular features of HEW:

The HATIM Evangelical Wing being one of the most important bodies of the college, takes care of the Worship Services and works for the inspiring and the nourishment of the spiritual life of the community. It has taken up the initiative of the Sunday Afternoon English Service since 17th August 2008 till date.

HEW conducts English Worship Service every Sunday Afternoon during normal Academic session. Different school children and local youth group used to join the services time to time.

HEW along with HATIM Authority used to organize Advance Christmas, Spiritual Nurturing, Palm Sunday, Good Friday, Easter program every year where each Program has a theme and a Speaker.

For the HEW Executive Committee members, Outing/Bethel/retreat used to be organized every year.

HEW used to organize different charity programs for different Homes and Centres.

The students contribute certain amounts of money and old clothes for those reasons. This has been a tradition every year. HEW used to organize charity for the sick students every now and then.

Activities as HEW:

The HEW visited different churches and introduce ourselves. The HEW participate in MTKP Inkhawmpui in the year 2010. HEW led praise and worship at Baptist Youth Federation of India (BYFI) Conference at Serkawn church in the year 2015.

From 2016 till then every year HEW leaders attend State Leadership Training camp.

In the year 2019, the HEW hosted State Leadership Training Camp at our Hatim campus and in the year 2020, HEW organized Evangelistic camp through ZOOM app (online) under the guidance of Union of Evangelical Student of India.

MAIN ACTIVITIES FROM JULY 2018 TILL MARCH 2019

1. **Conducting regular Sunday Worship Service**

The HATIM Evangelical Wing has been conducting a regular Sunday worship Services every Sunday morning and afternoon. The services are conducted in English. A bible study has been conducted every Sunday morning where Speakers from outside the community are mostly invited in the afternoon service. The Afternoon English Worship Service takes place at the permanent campus, Kawmzawl since 17th February 2019. It is open for all where the outsiders can also join freely.

2. **Equipment purchased**

The HEW has purchased several equipment's during the current academic session such as:

- (i) Tea Urn
- (ii) Two Feedback Monitors
- (iii) Repairing of Mixer, Keyboard, Speaker and Amplifier
- (iv) Miscellaneous items (Drum stick, guitar string, HDMI cable etc.)

3. **Organizing fund raising program**

The Evangelical Wing had raised funds in the residences and the commission was used for the procurement of necessary tools.

4. **Training on the handling of the projector**

The training was successfully organized for one day and was led by the senior adviser Sir H. Lalruatkima.

5. **Organizing Spiritual Nurturing Program**

The HATIM Evangelical Wing had organized a Spiritual Nurturing Program on 14th- 16th September 2018 and this was the second time the HEW had taken up the full responsibilities. Upa Dr. Andrew Lalhmangaiha was the speaker and he spoke on the theme "Be Prepared" with a supporting verse taken from 2 Timothy 4:2 which was chosen by the HEW executive meeting.

6. Giving out Charity to the people in need

As a tradition, the HEW had given a charity to the needy ones at the end of the semester. The donations were collected among the students in the form of cash and clothing. The total money received Rs. 14,590 was given to the District Jail, Lunglei on 23rd November 2018 while the clothes collected was given to Hmunthar, BCM mission field.

7. Organizing Advance Christmas Program

The HEW has taken up the responsibility of the college Advance Christmas Program 2018 on 25th November 2018 at HATIM Auditorium. Upa Lalankima, Asst. Professor in AICS was the speaker for the day.

8. Participating in the State Leadership Training Camp 2018

The HEW sent six campers and two volunteers to participate in the State Leadership Training Camp organized by the Union of Evangelical Students of India-North East, Mizoram Teaching and Training Dept. It was hosted by Govt. Zirtiri Residential Science College, Aizawl.

9. Conducting fellowship and prayer meeting

The HEW has been organizing a fellowship and a prayer meeting for the first time in the community. It was conducted once every week since February 2019. It was conducted by the executive members of the HATIM Evangelical Wing.

This camp had been the biggest of its kind; with 76 campers from different EU units. It was organized by Union of Evangelical Students of India-North East, Mizoram Teaching and Training Dept. The state coordinator Mr. P.M. Philip and his wife Ms. Salome were the speakers during the camp; the theme for this camp was “Lead 10:11” based on John 10:11.

About RRC: Red Ribbon Club (RRC) is a comprehensive promotional and preventive intervention to enhance voluntary blood donation as well as mainstream HIV & AIDS prevention, care & support and treatment impact, mitigation, stigma reduction, among the youth in educational institutions. It will also prepare and promote youth peer educators within and outside the campuses.

Goal: Red Ribbon Club formation in colleges and institutions is to encourage peer-to-peer messaging on HIV prevention and to provide a safe space for young people to seek clarifications of their doubts and on myths surrounding HIV/AIDS.

RRC in HATIM: It is difficult to trace the history of RRC in HATIM relating to actual appointments, structures and activities due to constant administrative changes and financial constrain. However, since 2020 RRC, HATIM is merged with NSS Unit, HATIM until March, 2022 a separate committee is established and Mr. R. Lallianzela, Asst Professor, Dept. of Social Work is appointed as the Nodal Officer of RRC,HATIM. The committee members include 02 male and 02 female representatives each from HATIM Students Union (HSC) and HATIM Evangelical Wing (HEW). RRC HATIM has its own bank account and is funded by Mizoram State Aids Control Society (MSACS).

Rural Camp means the Social Work students stay in a rural village for experience and to make a study of the different elements and structures of the village. The students are expected to prepare an analysis report of the living condition of the people in that village. It helps the students in understanding the core of rural social life, their problems and needs and to help them in preparing a plan for Social Work Practice.

The department of Bachelor of Social Work, Higher and Technical Institute, Mizoram makes serious efforts to make the curriculum more oriented to skill-based practical. Rural camp is part of the curriculum for the 3rd Semester BSW Students. It allows them to get rural exposure, rural lifestyle, and to experience group living of the village.

Preliminary preparation for the camp

Students are given a big chance of taking up responsibilities with leadership. The camp leaders are elected by the students.

The selection of the Camp was done by the camp leaders with the help of the faculty members. According to the discussion and understanding, a rural village called Zotuitlang was chosen for the rural camp.

The students are divided into various sub-committees such as Mess, Programme, Sports, Sound and Media Transport, Finance, and Medical which are delegated with their responsibilities. Henceforth discussions were held to devise the desired needs and plans like identifying needs, programmes, source of funds, collecting materials, visiting, and contacting special guests through professional interaction.

The leader has to communicate between the camp supervisor and the students hence to arrange preparations for every meeting. They analyze the general meeting feedback of the camp supervisor and make some instructions to committee leaders for the betterment in the next meeting.

Day-wise Activity

Day 1 (Dt. 9th September, 2019):

The campers along with Miss C. Lalremtluangi departed from the college at 11:00 am. And reached Zotuitlang at around 2:00 pm. The allotment was done with the help of the VC members in different houses. At night there was a meeting with the key leaders such as YMA members, Village Council members, MHIP members, MUP members from 7:00 pm. - 8:30 pm.

Day 2 (Dt. 10th September, 2019):

10:00 am – 12:00 noon: '*Clean Zotuitlang*' was organized by the students in collaboration with NSS HATIM Unit. Refreshments were served by the students. After that, dustbins were placed in different parts of the locality along with the village key leaders.

2:00 pm – 4:00 pm: In the afternoon, the students cleaned the community hall thoroughly. After that, the girls shifted to MUP Run and the boys to the

Community Hall.

Day 3 (Dt. 11th September 2019):

10:00 am – 3:00 pm: Community sports were organized by the students. It started with devotion. There were different items like Football, Volleyball, Insuknawr, Races. The participants were selected from both the community and the students. Prizes were given for each of the participants. From this programme, the students gained more support from the villagers which had made it easier to gather them in other programmes as well.

6:00 pm. – 7:30 pm: Church services were attended at the United Pentecostal Church in which they present a tray and The College magazine. The students also presented a song in the service.

Day 4 (Dt. 12th September 2019):

10:00 am – 12:00 pm: Four schools were visited such as Primary School, Middle School, High School, and Anganwadi. A Wall Clock was presented to each of the schools. The School information were also collected through the teachers.

1:00 pm – 3:00 pm: An Awareness programme was organized in collaboration with agriculture. In this programme, 80 people had participated.

Day 5 (13th September 2019):

10:00 am – 11:00 am: An Awareness programme was organized in collaboration with the District Child Protection Unit in which the theme was Child Rights and Protection of Children. Middle School and Primary School were also invited in this programme 130 people had participated.

12:00 – 4:00 pm: Free Medical Clinic was organized in collaboration with Mobile Medical Unit, Lunglei. Three doctors from Civil Hospital came with their staff. Also, 151 people had come for a checkup.

Day 6 (14th September 2019):

10:00 am – 3:00 pm: Animal Rearing and Husbandry awareness programme

was organized which was followed by Animal Free Clinic. The people who had come to have a check-up on their pets were around 128 people.

6:00 pm – 7:30 pm: Church service was attended at The Salvation Army in which they presented a Tray and the College magazine. Also, the students presented a beautiful song.

Day 7 (Dt. 15th September 2019):

10:00 am – 12 noon: Church service was attended at Baptist Church of Mizoram, Zotuitlang in which the students presented a song in the service. The college report was also given by Miss C. Lalremtluangi.

1:00 pm – 3:00 pm: Joint fellowship was organized at BCM, Zotuitlang in which the different churches of the youth were gathered at BCM Church.

6:00 pm – 7:30 pm: Church Service was attended at Presbyterian Church in which the students presented a Tray and the College Magazine.

8:00 pm – 11:00 pm: The movie 'Scooty' was shown to the community where a large number of people gathered in the Community Hall. After the movie, a wall clock was presented to each of the village key leaders and a photo session was held till late at night.

Day 8 (16th September 2019):

9:30 am – 12 Noon: After all the objectives were fulfilled successfully, the students bid farewell to the community and headed home to Lunglei.

The Social Work trainees of the Department of Social Work, HATIM had a useful and fruitful experience through the social rural camp at Zotuitlang Village. The camp was well organized with benevolent guidance and the help of the faculty members and the management of the college. The involvement of the trainees was also well appreciated. The support of the college also played a vital part in the success of the camp. The Social Work trainee thank the Principal of the college, the camp supervisor, the Head of the Social Work Department, and other staff members who made this Social rural camp a valuable learning experience in their career.

INTRODUCTION

The 10th Rural Camp organized by Department of Social Work, HATIM is a field practicum prescribed in the syllabus for Bachelor of Social Work under Mizoram University.

The camp was held for five days starting from 24th February, 2021 to 1st March, 2021 at Putlungasih, Lunglei District, Mizoram.

They were given one week for the camp preparations. The expenditures for the camp were all calculated beforehand - transportations, mess, sports, mementos, etc. As they needed the sponsorship from the NSS, they had also helped them in their service and in turn the NSS gave those dustbins which later were given to the village community. The college also gave them song books and magazines which were gifted to the village communities as well.

The campers were 22 in total along with supervisors namely Mr. C. Lalhlimpaia and Ms Rebecca L.P. Lalnunhlui. The campers were all very active and fulfilled all their duties and portfolios which are assigned for them.

Putlungasih is in Thorang assembly constituency, under Mr. Zodintluanga, MLA. It is located in the Eastern part of Lunglei district. The longitude is 22*57 31"N, the latitude 92*36 45"E. The total population is 1785, major population is Bru. There are 311 households.

The campers did several activities which include PRA, survey, hiking, games and sports. These activities had helped them in understanding the village and also helped in building rapport with the village people.

History of the community

There were no written records so the exact time cannot be known from the community elders. Putlungasih was established in 1920 and was named "Putlungasih" in the year between 1922-1927. The village was named after Pasaltha Pu Zatlunga as he was a great and well known hunter who was really good at hunting.

ACTIVITIES

During the stay at Putlungasih, several activities were conducted such as PRA, Survey, Sports, Film show, Cleanliness drives, etc., so that good rapport can be built and that more information on the community can be collected.

1. PRA

PRA is a methodology of learning rural life and their environment from the rural people. It requires researchers / field workers to act as facilitators to help local people conduct their own analysis, plan and take action accordingly. It is based on the principle that local people are creative and capable and can do their own investigations, analysis, and planning.

Timeline

Timeline provide the historical information of the community which involves important events of the past recalled by local people. The information was collected from the elders and the leaders. It can also go together with community profiling.

Findings:

Development and growth of the community can be found from timeline as establishment of certain institutions can be seen from year to year. It can be seen that education and churches are seen highly by the community.

Social Mapping

Social mapping is an option to identify households based on predefined indicators relating to socio-economic conditions. It is not drawn to scale but depicts what the local people believe to be relevant and important for them.

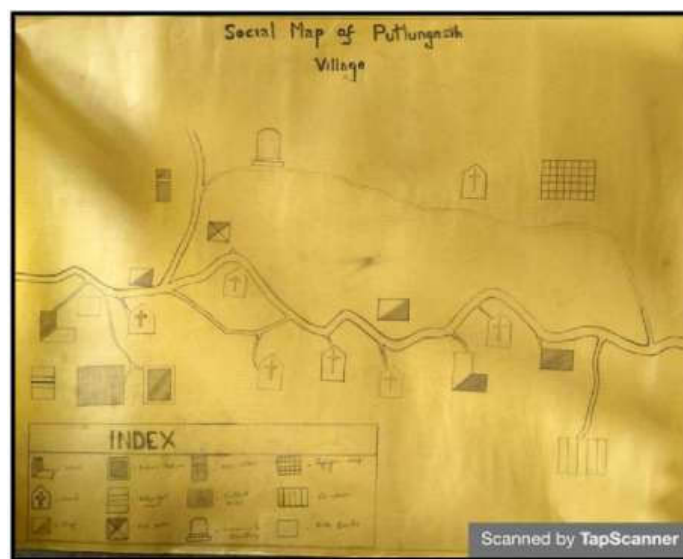


Figure 02: Social Map

Findings:

Social map helps in understanding the habitation of the local people. When looking at the social map of the community, it helps to see the places and roads of the areas and most visited areas can also be seen.

Resource and Mobility Map

A resource map is mainly drawn to present information on land, water and tree resources, land used, land and soil types, cropping pattern, land and water management, productivity, watersheds, degraded lands, treatment plan, etc.

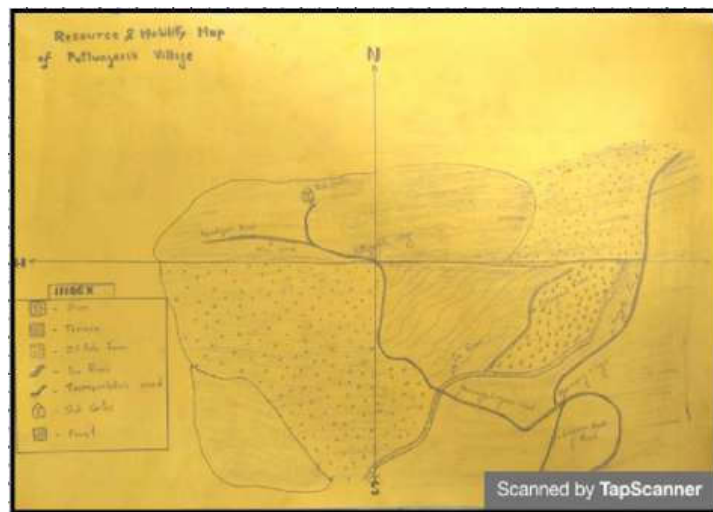


Figure 03: Resource and social mobility map

Findings:

There is an abundant supply of water; moreover, it is surrounded by a dense forest which is an important and beneficial for the livelihood of the community people. On the other hand, they lack in government offices and agencies which makes issues for the community, especially in the needs of banks and health care centers.

2. SURVEY

Objectives: To have better understanding of the village community.

Content of the questionnaire:

The survey questions consist of 11 eleven sub themes namely - family profile, family details, livelihood pattern, settlement pattern, education, health, household assets, animal rearing, community strength, community weakness and community needs.

Sample size:

The sample size for this survey is 150 household out of 232 household which is 65% of the total household.

Sampling:

Due to shortage of time, convenient sampling is employed for this survey.

Findings:

In the light of the survey, it can be clearly seen that Putlungasih village is mostly a patriarchal family and the major religion is Christianity. Their economic status is mostly BPL and their main source of income is from agriculture. Most of the village elders are illiterate but in the present condition the youths are now much fonder of education.

The health condition of the community is quite good and most of them are not enrolled in Health Care Scheme. The lifestyle of the people is quite simple and there is no much RCC buildings and valuable assets. Besides, they are more interested in poultry farming and keeping domestic animals.

Lastly, the main reason that the people of Putlungasih enjoy their community is because of their forefathers dwelt in this community, and also according to the majority of them, they had moved to this village and enjoyed it because of the mass production of vegetables and crops with good water resources.

3. SPORTS

Sports day was organized on 27th February, 2021 at Putlungasih field. 150 villagers attended this event. They were divided into 4 sections and section no. 4 was a combination of BSW students and YMA Office bearers.

Several games were played like football, volleyball (girls and boys), insuknawr (boys), sack race (children), tug of war (boys & girls). The community youth and the students had participated in this event.

During this sports event, the students of BSW and the community members had built a good rapport. Programme started at 10:30a.m. And opening ceremony was done by Rbt. Henry Kissinger with a prayer.

Sport activities are - Race (2 members on each section), football match (section 1 & section 4), (section 2 & 3) final (section 1 and 2) - section 1 won, volleyball girls (section 1 & 4) - Section 4 won, sack race (children), insuknawr (section 3),

tug of war boys (section 1 winner) and girls (section 1 won).

There was a Prize distribution, a short speech by the VCP and vote of thanks from H. Vanlalmuankimi, sport in charge.

Purpose/objectives:

- To build a good rapport among the community members.
- To build unity among the community members.
- To observe their fitness and health of the youth through sport.

There was process meeting with the key leaders to call together the community people. Organizing different kinds of Sport Outcome, through this we can observe that the unity among the community are better because of a kind and gentle interaction through sports.

4. FILM SHOW

Movie night was held at 26th February 2021 at B.C.M hall. Name of movie was "SCOOTY (Mizo romantic comedy movie). Around 30 people (Thirty, excluding the campers) were attending the show. Light refreshment was served. Most of the attendees were children between 7-17 years of age.

The main objective for this film show was for enjoyment and rapport building. So, the movie was light and easy to understand. It was comedic as well.

Finding:

The community is mostly farmers and daily workers, they spend the day working and then using their night time for resting. So, most of the community members were unable to participate and it is not up to the mark. There was no system fail and the programme went well. The programme was successful.

5. CLEANLINESS DRIVE

There was a sanitation campaign on Saturday morning (i.e., 27th February, 2021) which was sponsored by the NSS. The main aim of the campaign was to let them be aware of their health and cleanliness. Dustbin had been distributed to the BBC, BBC Emanuel, BCM and, BCM Comprehensive School which was given by the camp leaders.

c) HEALTH

An interaction with the local nurse the trainee can observe the health condition of the village. The main problems of the local have skin diseases and cancer.

- 1) Summer: Typhoid, Malaria
- 2) Rainy: Skin diseases, malaria
- 3) Winter: Skin diseases and Stomach Ulcer

In the village witchcraft are still being practice but majority of the people went to the pharmacy for medication.

Some of the local medicines are-

- 1) Fartuahpil – Pumna
- 2) Aieng- Pumna

- 3) Japan Hlo- wound
- 4) Neem- Chicken pox
- 5) Phelsep- Ruhtliakzawmna.

In the local there are two nurses of different denomination from BCM and Presbyterian. The trainee could not meet the ASHA as the ASHA went to Lunglei.

From the activities and time spent, time was managed according to the routine which was set. From the time management, all the camper was punctual as expect.

Strength of the community

1) Regular water supply:

Putlungasih has regular water supply and sometimes even get water supply twice a day.

2) Mass production of vegetables and crops:

Putlungasih is one with the village which got mass production of crops and vegetables. Even during survey, when the community people were being questioned why they moved from their previous place to Putlungasih, most of them said that it was because it was easier to get vegetables and make a living out of them.

Weakness of the community

1) Resource management:

They had the resources they need but they do not know how to manage them. They have regular water supply but they do not know how to or how important it is to conserve them. One could see children playing with water and sometimes even see the water overflowing. They have dustbins, but just a few care to throw them inside the bin. Majority of the wastes were lying on the ground, some even near the dustbins.

2) Cleanliness:

As mentioned above, there were lots of wastes to be seen. Their pet animals are on loose, so there were also lots of dungs to see as well.

3) They are not aware of their own needs:

From the survey observation, when the community people were asked what their felt needs were for the community, only few were able to answer the question. But majority of them were not aware of it.

4) Lack of brotherhood:

Some of the community people and the community leaders from the survey said that they had a lack of sense of brotherhood or unity. Fights had broken out once in a while and they feel hesitant to deal with one another.

Possible Social Work Intervention

a) Group Work:

Group work is suggested because as mentioned above, they do not have a sense of unity. Through group work, they can sort out their problems and learn to understand each other with the help of a group worker. This will also enable them to help one another in the problems and learn how to deal with their problems.

b) Awareness Campaign:

Conducting awareness programme is suggested to the public on the basis of resource management as mentioned before, they have the resources they need but it is not managed well. So Awareness Campaign is deemed necessary for it, as well as for cleanliness.

Conclusion

The campers had a transect walk, Survey and Sanitation Campaign. From the observations that they had from these, they had seen how they have the resources that they need, but they do not know how to manage them well. They have dustbins, but lots of waste was thrown away near them. Although some places were clean, majority of it was not. From the transect walk and survey, they also got to see different types of houses and their ways of living.

Activities like hiking, sports and church activities were also held. From these they had built rapport with the village communities and also building stronger rapport among the campers themselves learning how to communicate and cooperate with one another.

They were able to conduct PRA with the help of the YMA members and also went to several community and church leaders for case studies.

From this rural camp, not only did they learn new things about the community but also had learning and improvements among themselves. Each of the campers had their own responsibilities and even if it was their first time doing most things, they had learned how to take responsibilities and also is quick to help one another which is important part of group work as it is necessary to have good cooperation.

Rural camp is where there is chance to practice what has been learnt in theory. In many ways, they learned that they still lack in many things on how to conduct activities and how to communicate as well as recording. But with the assistance from the supervisors and campers themselves, they were able to complete the planned activities and also gifted song books and magazines before they depart.
