Having the campus life revived and activated again after a two-year long online and blended mode of teaching-learning programme compelled by the Covid-19 pandemic, it was indeed exciting and at the same time, challenging to attain normalcy in every aspect of academics and the surrounding environment. My reports here includes academic and co-curricular activities and infrastructural growth on the campus.

A. GENERAL:

1. Valedictory Service 2022 successfully organised: We were forced to pause for two years in organising Valedictory service in the years 2020 and 2022. Two batches of students had left the institute in flying colours during these periods. By the grace of God, however, we could resume our tradition in organising a Valedictory Service in May, 2022.

2. Resuming on-campus (offline) education: After a two-year long disturbance of academic activities on the Campus due to the COvid-19 pandemic and its related restrictions, the Campus was re-opened for offline classes and other activities from the beginning of the Odd Semester, 2022. It was both a thrilling and challenging experience for both students and employees of the institute.

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3. Parents Teachers Meet: Continuing with our traditional practice, the Parents Teachers meeting were organised for two times each for every department. This is done with a purpose of enhancing relationship and boosting our efforts to bring about good education for our students.

A. EXTRA AND CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:

1. Felicitation Programme for University Rank Holders: A felicitation programme was organised in congratulation of the University Rank holders of 2022 from various academic departments. Of all the 11 rank holders, we had subject toppers in Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA) and English. Incentive Cash Awards were given away to all the rank holders both by the Institute and the Education Department, Baptist Church of Mizoram (BCM).

2. New students induction programme: New students induction programme was conducted for all 1st Semester students during 4th – 7th of July, 2022 where orientation sessions for Institutional rules and regulations, academic department, discipline, Library and Laboratories took place.

3. Parents-Teachers Meet: A time of department-wise meeting with parents of the students was held during 9th-18th of August, 2022 through video conference and offline mode.

4. Orientation Programme for non-teaching staff: An orientation/refresher programme was organised for the non-teaching staff of the institute on 23rd August, 2022.

5. UPSC Challenge Inter-College Quiz Competition: Two students were sent to participate in the name of the Institute to compete in the UPSC Challenge Inter-College Quiz Competition, which was organised by the Mizo Students' Union (MSU) at Aizawl during 25th August – 14th Sept, 2022.

6. HATIM Literary Club: Literary Club was established for the first time in the history of the Institute and the first meeting was held on 9th September, 2022 which saw 64 enrolments to the club from the students.

7. HATIM English Worship Service resumed: After a long break compelled by the Covid-19 pandemic, the English Worship Service which is open for the general public resumed on 11th September, 2022.

Spiritual Nurturing Programme(SNP) was organised during 16th-18th September, 2022 after a gap of two years due to CoViD-19 related regulations. The theme for this year's SNP was "Thy Kingdom come"(-Matt. 6:10) and the speaker was Rev. Dr. R. Lalthanmawia, AGS i/c Mission, Baptist Church of Mizoram.

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9. Lushai Cup Inter-Departmental Football Tournament: The teaching and non-teaching staff formed a football team and participated in the Lushai Cup Inter-Departmental Football Tournament, 2022 at Lena Sports Stadium for the first time as a special invitee team.

10. Principal's Tea: The Principal's Tea is an open air programme initiated this academic year with a view to giving the students time to hear from the Principal on various reports, announcements, gueries and answers to guestions, if any during breaks between classes. Tea is served for all students during the Principal's Tea and verbal communication from the Principal is made. The Principal's Tea was held two times this academic year i.e., on 28th October, 2022 and 3rd February, 2023.

11. Community Cleaning Service: A community cleaning service was held on the 2nd October, 2022.

12. Free Eye Clinic: Christian Hospital Serkawn and the Eyecare Hospital, Aizawl on a collaborative effort held a free Eye Clinic at HATIM Campus on 15th November, 2022.

13. Thanksgiving Day: A thanksgiving programme was held by all employees on 16th November, 2022.

14. Inauguration of History Museum: On initiative of the Department of History, the first ever Museum on the Campus was inaugurated by the Principal on 18th April, 2023.

15. Cleanest Institution Award: HATIM received the First Prize in the category of institutions in Cleanliness Competition for Lunglei Town, 2022, which was organised by the Urban Development and Poverty Alleviation (UD&PA) Department.

16. Hill Fest 2023: Hill Fest 2023 was successfully organised on the 17th and 18th of March, 2023 as a result of concerted efforts of various Interest Clubs, Cells, Clubs and Committees, Academic Departments, all college staff and students for the second time after Hill Fest 2019. There were over 42 stalls and over 15 sponsors. A good number of individuals and teams/groups participated in various competitions. It catered to over 3000 visitors and the theme of Hill Fest 2023 was *"Vintage".*

17. The MzU Inspection Team Visit: An Inspection Team comprising of the Director, College Development Council (MzU), Head of the Department of History (MzU), Head of the Department of English (MzU), Expert from the Department of Social Work (MzU) and Jt. Director (Admin), Higher & Technical Education Department, Government of Mizoram visited the Institute on 4th May, 2023 on inspection duty for permanent affiliation of BSW, English, Philosophy and History subjects.

18. Workshop on Implementation of National Education Policy 2020: The IQAC, HATIM organised a One Day Workshop on Implementation of the National Education Policy 2020 on the 5th May, 2023. The resource person Prof. Lalbiakdiki Hnamte delivered an insightful presentation.

19. General Staff Meeting: The IQAC and the Staff Welfare Committee jointly organised a general staff meeting on the 10th May, 2023. The Forenoon Session was occupied by Reports from the IQAC on progress of the SSR and distribution of remaining works to faculty and non-teaching staff. The Afternoon Session contained amendment of Staff Welfare Constitution and Election to the new Office Bearers of the Staff Welfare Committee.

- (c) HIV Awareness Campaign: The Red Ribbon Club in collaboration with the Social Work Department organised an HIV Awareness Campaign at Cherhlun Higher Secondary School.
- (d) Electoral Awareness Programme: The Electoral Literacy Club organised an Electoral Awareness Programme inviting resource persons from the District Election Office, Lunglei.
- (e) IBM SkillsBuild Project: The Academic and Career Councelling Cell organised a sensitisation programme for online e-learning platform provided by CSRBOX Team to implement the IBM SkillsBuild Project.
- (f) World AIDS Day 2022: The Red Ribbon Club in collaboration with the NSS, HATIM observed the World AIDS Day 2022 with the theme "Putting Ourselves to the Test: Achieving Equity to End HIV".
- (g) National Voters' Day: The Electoral Literacy Club organised observance of the National Voters' Day on 25th January, 2023. The community members vowed a pledge to have firm faith in democracy and to exercise their voting rights in every election.
- (h) International Women's Day: The Women's Cell organised a programme of observance of International Women's Day at the Multipurpose Hall on 8th March, 2023.
- (i) Workshop on SUP Free Lifestyle: the Eco Club and Mizoram Pollution Control Board organised a 'Workshop on SUP Free Lifestyle' with sustainable alternatives on 9th March, 2023.

- (j) Career Awareness Programme: A Career Awareness Programme was held at the Multipurpose Hall, which was organised by the Academic and Career Counselling Cell in collaboration with the Information and Public Relations (I&PR) Department, Lunglei and the IQAC, HATIM on 1st May, 2023.
- 12. HATIM Students' Council (HSC) activities:
 - (a) Election of Office Bearers for 2022-23: The new Office Bearers for HSC for the year 2022-23 were elected by the general body of students on 22nd July, 2023.
 - (b) Freshers' Social: A programme for welcoming new students was organised by the HSC on the 25th July, 2022 at the College Multipurpose Hall.
 - (c) College Sports Week: The college Sports Week was organised during 4th-9th August, 2022 at various locations where number of indoor games, athletic and field events were incorporated. Mizo cultural dances were incorporated as items of competitions for the first time in the history of HATIM this year. 'Clark House' was the Champion House.
 - (d) Teachers' Day: A grand programme was organised by the HSC in celebration of the Teachers Day on 5th September, 2022 at the Multipurpose Hall.
 - (e) Cleanliness Drive: As a part of Cleanliness Drive initiative, cleaning of the Campus was organised by the HSC on 30th September, 2022.
 - (f) HSC Election for 2023-24: Election for the Office Bearers of the HSC for the year 2023-24 was held on the 1st May, 2023.
 - (g) Community Cleaning Service: Community Cleaning Service was organised by the HSC on 3rd May, 2023 where various public places, offices and classrooms in the Campus were cleaned up.

(h) Office Bearers Charge Handover Programme: The charge handover programme was organised at the Principal's Chamber on 9th May, 2023. After the Gen. Serectary and the Treasurer gave general reports and financial reports, the outgoing Office Bearers (OBs) handed over various charges to the OBs of 2023-24 respectively.

13. National Service Scheme (NSS) activities:

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- (a) Field Trip: A field trip programme was organised by the NSS Unit on 31st August, 2022 in collaboration with the Department of History within the areas of Pukpui and Zotlang where students and teachers explored natural caves in the areas.
- (b) Assessment of NSS Activities: State NSS Officer-cum-Deputy Secretary, NSS Cell visited the Institute to conduct assessment on activities of the NSS Units of the Institute.
- (c) State Anti-Tobacco Day: The NSS Unit and the Anti-Tobacco Cell in collaboration with the District Tobacco Control Cell (DTCC), Lunglei District, Lunglei successfully observed the 9th Mizoram State Anti-Tobacco Day on 12th September, 2022.
- (d) Rashtriya Poshan Maah (National Nutrition Week): An awareness campaign on "Nutrition and Education" was organised by the NSS Units on 19th September, 2022.
- (e) Cleanliness Drive: A Cleanliness Drive was organised by the NSS volunteers at Cherhlun village on 20th September, 2022.
- (f) NSS Foundation Day and Blood Donation Camp: In observance of the NSS Foundation Day-2022, the *Red Ribbon Club and NSS, HATIM* in collaboration with Major Blood Bank, Civil Hospital, Lunglei, organised a Blood Donation camp and made a record of the largest number of donations (109) at a time for this year received by the Civil Hospital, Lunglei.

- (g) Rashtriya Ekta Diwas: NSS Unit, HATIM participated in pledge taking and unity run as part of observance of Rastria Ekta Diwas (National Unity Day, 2022) which was organised by the Deputy Commissioner, Lunglei District, Mizoram on 31st October, 2022.
- (h) Janjatiya Gaurav Diwas: The Program Officers and NSS volunteers participated in the procession of tribal artists and dancers in celebration of Janjatiya Gaurav Diwas in Lunglei on 15th November, 2022.
- (i) **Blood Donation Camp:** In collaboration with the Red Ribbon Club, HSC and HATIM Evangelical Wing and Major Blood Bank, Civil Hospital, Lunglei, the NSS Unit, HATIM organised a Blood Donation Camp at the Campus. A total of 151 units of blood was donated.

B. INFRASTRUCTURE:

1. Academic Block 'C':

Construction of the Academic Block 'C' is partially complete and the Ground Floor was occupied from August, 2022 by two batches of B.A. students, one batch of B.Com students and faculty of Commerce and English Departments. The basement was also eventually completed and it houses all the three existing Laboratories.

2. Students' Parking Lot:

Construction of Students Parking Lot that can accommodate about 100 two wheelers was completed and is being used by students who come by their own vehicles.

3. Teachers' Inn:

Plan is made for provision to female single faculty members to stay as guests in the Ladies' Residence during weekdays with only minimal expenditure for either accommodation and/or fooding. Therefore, work on construction of Teachers' Inn was initiated during this academic session. About 90% of work is completed by now and it is expected highly that the Inn can be made to function from July, 2023.

4. Basketball Court:

A permanent Basketball Court has been dreamt about ever since we started to occupy the permanent Campus for use of students and staff on the Campus. However, it was difficult to realise due to fund constraints.

5. New IT Laboratory / Centre:

The Institute's Computer Laboratory was previously accommodated in the Library Floor of the Administrative Building with only a very congested space. However, there was no space for upgradation of the Laboratory without a larger space, hence, the Basement of the Academic Block 'C' was furnished and completed to accommodate all the existing laboratories. The new Computer Laboratory was renamed as Information Technology Laboratory/Centre (IT Laboratory/Centre) and the number of systems increased from 20 to 37 during this year.

6. Language Laboratory:

The new Language Laboratory is constructed at the basement of the Academic Block 'C' adjacent to the IT Laboratory for the purpose of Language training and practice for students with a capacity of 20 systems.

7. Psychology Laboratory:

For the first time at HATIM, a Laboratory for the Department of Psychology namely, *Psychology Laboratory* was established this year with a capacity of 25 students at the basement of the Academic Block 'C'. Various human behavioural studies are conducted in this Laboratory.

8. Extension of the Multipurpose Hall:

The present Multipurpose Hall which is located at the top Floor of the Ladies' Residence building is now congested when assembly of all students is necessary. Therefore, the exterior part of the floor of the Hall was covered up in extension with roof and railings to make room for accommodation of more people.

9. Principal's Quarters:

Work on construction of the Principal's Quarters started in October, 2022 on the Campus and about 35% of work is complete till date. The work of construction is managed and looked after by the Property Department of BCM and supervisory work at the spot is done by the employees of the Institute.

10. Mini Amphitheatre:

A Mini Amphitheatre is constructed near the Academic Block 'C' for the purpose of organising open air functions and gatherings with a capacity of roughly 300 individuals.

11. Internal Roads:

Extension work of THE Campus internal roads was made with concrete pavement to complete the cycle of vehicle conveyance through the Academic and Administrative area. With this work done, it is now possible to make entrance and exit possible at both ends of the area.

12. Students' Council Office:

Office of the Students' Council was constructed and completed to be made functional from July, 2023 at the Students' Centre. It will serve as a meeting room, storage and work place for the Students' Council Office Bearers.

With the upcoming implementation of the National Education Policy, the Institute strives to universalise itself for all the stakeholders through thick and thin by ever extending its mission directions to bring about excellence and earnest commitment. It is our endeavour to nurture young minds and provide them with holistic development through various forms of teaching delivered through various modes and platforms. We hold on to the principles of seeking, sharing and serving to provide the youth of today lifelong experiential learning, teaching them through examples of integrity and accountability.



Report on IQAC

INTRODUCTION: The University Grants Commission (UGC), established in November 1956 as a statutory body of the Government of India through an Act of Parliament, to monitor higher educational institutions' standards, the UGC established the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) as an autonomous body, under section 12(ccc) of its Act in September 1994. NAAC has been instilling a momentum of quality consciousness amongst Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs), aiming for continuous improvement. However, lasting improvements in standards cannot come about only by accreditation from outside, once in five years. An internal mechanism for sustenance, assurance and enhancement of the quality culture of education imparted by them, therefore, becomes essential. Recognizing the importance of such an institutional internal quality system the UGC has taken a policy decision to direct all HEIs to establish an internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a quality sustenance measure. The prime task of the IQAC is to develop a system of conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the overall performance of the institutions.

Following this, the Higher and Technical Institute Mizoram (HATIM) established IQAC for quality enhancement. Since quality enhancement is a continuous process, the IQAC became a part of the institution's system and work towards the realisation of goals of quality enhancement and sustenance. Since its inception in 2007, HATIM as an institution has come a long way. It started with just two Departments and now has eight departments within a span of 16 years.

II: Student Enrollment (As of March, 2023)

Departmental Activities

I. Rural Camp: Camping at rural area is not just an outdoor activity. Typically, it is theory into practice session with different objectives to achieve. For this session, students of 5th and 3rd semester jointly organized Rural Camp at Cherhlun, Hnahthial District during 19th September - 26th September, 2023. Campers (Students) exercised Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) and conducted Socio-economic household survey covering more than 100 households.

II. Block Placement (Internship): The 6th semester students have a block placement as part of their field practicum, it is a final training process at the agency or organization of their choice before graduation. Block placement was arranged to conduct outside of Lunglei town, by this time student carried out block placement in different parts of outside Lunglei district of Mizoram such as Aizawl, Kolasip, Champhai, Siaha, Serchhip and lawngtlai district.

III. Field Work Practicum: Field Practicum is an integral part of the department of social work. Every student of Social Work needs to undergo fieldwork training at least once/tice in every week at the various agencies to integrate theories paper they learn in the classroom into practical setting. Let me take this opportunity to give credit to all the agencies who host our students viz; *Grace Society, MHIP Drop-in Centre, Dist. Child Protection Office, FLAT, Onix Special School, WADA, Child Care Centre.*

IV. Individual and Group Counselling: This meant that Students meet with their respective field work supervisors on IC/GC period, in which academic related issues are discussed, briefing and guidance regarding field work practicum as well as personal support are given by the teachers. Students maintain field work report file. In mentoring period, students were provided free environment where students openly elevated themselves and teachers act as an advocate for student's best interest. Mentors-mentee (Teachers-Students) interaction has incredible impacts on various aspects of the life of the students.

V. Practical Soft skill training and Moral education: Beyond the classroom teaching, the department has implemented personality development activity. Last period of the Friday is spare for Soft skill training and Morale education. Teachers were assigned to give lecture and practical session on specific topics which focused on building students' moral values and personalities outside the classroom.

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VI. MoU with ASER: The department has signed a Memorandum of understanding with annual citizen-led household survey agency called Annual Status of Education Report (ASER) on 2nd September, 2022. As per MoU, selected 21 students were engaged in survey in the selected 30 villages within Lunglei district.

VII. SEIL Tour/Host SEIL Delegates: On 15th November, 2022 our department hosted SEIL (Student's Experience in Inter-State Living) delegates meeting at the college auditorium for university students from Punjab, Haryana and Maharashtra. The program was designed for the experience sharing of the delegates and orientation of ABVP (Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad) and SEIL tour. In follow-up to this, the department received invitation from AVBP to represent Lunglei district for SEIL. BSW 4th semester students were assigned to represent the department as SEIL tour delegates to pay an exposure visit across various states of India as part of youth integration program during 1st February to 25th February, 2023. On 1st March, 2023 the department arranged SEIL tour experience sharing program at the college auditorium with a grand dinner.

VIII. Observation of World Social Work Day cum Parents-Teachers Meeting: The departmental faculty meeting arranged Parents-Teachers Meeting on 21st March as part of observation of World Social Work Day. Each teacher gave presentation and lecture on selected topics viz; College Rules and regulations, Field-work practicum, internal exams and marking system. This was followed by a cordial interactive session between the teachers and parents regarding students' academic performance, personal development, field work related issues etc. ------

2. 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The 2022-2023 academic session turned out to be quite smooth, undeterred, and eventful, except for the second week of July 2022 where we had to have a partial lockdown due to the slight hike in covid-19 infections within the community. DEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITIES

1. Parents-Teachers Meet: The Department of Philosophy hosted the annual Parents-Teachers Meet on August 16, 2022. Even though the meeting was supposed to take place online, the department requested the principal for permission to have it offline because of a significant amount of core students. Department teaching faculty, parents, and administrative staff were present at the meeting, which was held in the principal's office. They provided reports and the necessary informations regarding administrative rules and regulations, exams, leave requests, and details of fee structures for both academic and residential (hostel) accommodations. At this gathering, a sizable number of parents attended. Additionally, the department made sure that parents were aware of what their children were studying in college.

The Department of Philosophy, HATIM collaborated with the Department of Philosophy, Pachhunga University College on an Academic Career Counselling on 14th September, 2022. Dr. John C. Lalduhsaka, Head of Department, HATIM, as per invitation gave a one-day special lecture on *"What after BA-Philosophy"* at Pachhunga University College.

3. Students' Exchange Programme: The Students' Exchange Programme between Higher and Technical Institute Mizoram and Lunglei Government College was successfully organized as a two-day programme on 30th and 31st March, 2023 to provide a platform for students to experience, engage and learn more about philosophy.

On the first day, the students of LGC attended normal classes at HATIM following the scheduled class timing of the host institution. On the second day, the department welcomed Chawngdingpuii Chawngthu, Advocate, as a Resource Person who gave a talk on the relation between law and philosophy, the importance, significance and role of philosophy in the study and practice of law. The second session opened a Q&A and Open House Discussion with deep and meaningful questions addressed to the resource person and teachers by the students. Students were also given assignments to watch and submit a write up of their philosophical reflections of the movie "The Truman Show". Certificates were given to students with full attendance within the two days programme.

4. Inter-Department Collaboration between the Department of Education and Department of Philosophy, HATIM : "Open house discussion on Scholasticism" The Department of Education collaborated with the Department of Philosophy on a discussion on *Scholasticism* which is a part of the VI semester curriculum of the Department of Education under the paper: "Development of Educational Thought". The open house was held on the 13th of April, 2023, between 11:00 Am to 12:00 Noon. The Open House discussion was moderated by Miss Scully R. Laldinthari, Assistant Professor, dept. of education and Dr. John C. Lalduhsaka, HoD, Dept. of Philosophy was invited as the subject expert for the Q&A session.

5. DEPARTMENT ACTION PLAN: Among the three planned projects that the department had for the July 2022- May 2023 academic session, the department accomplished one project, i.e., the Students' Exchange Programme with Lunglei Government College, Lunglei. The remaining projects will be taken forward for the coming academic session, i.e., July 2023 to May 2024. A set of new projects/ plans have also been added to the department action plan.

ACTIVITIES:

1) On 4th July 2022 (Monday), the Department organised a felicitation programme in which the "History Award" (Citation and Cash), *i.e.*, Award for Top Tenner's Under Graduate Examination, MZU, was given to Lalrinngheti (1st Batch: 2019 - 2022) who secured 8th Rank in History subject.

2) On 15th August, 2022 (Monday), the Department had organised successfully 'Parents Teachers Meet - 2022' through Online mode.

3) On 31st August, 2022 (Wednesday), the Department, in collaboration with NSS Unit, HATIM, organised a Field Trip within the areas of Zotlang and Pukpui, Lunglei. As a part of *"Know Your Local History – Exploration of Caves"* the 5th Semester (13 students) and Teaching Faculties (5 Teachers) of History visited and explored three caves, namely, Puksei and Pukthing at Pukpui, and Bakpuk at Zotlang.

4) From 5th – 9th December, 2022, the Department organised a study tour on the theme *"Know Your History - Archaeological Field Study"* at Vangchhia, Champhai District, for the Final/3rd Year students. The students submitted their field study reports which were printed and made available for the Department and the College Library.

5) During the 25th & 26th of April, 2023, the two days *Faculty cum Student's Exchange Programme* with the Department of History, Gov't. J. Buana College, Lunglei, was organised successfully. The first day was organised at Gov't. J. Buana College, Lunglei, and the second day and the closing program were held at HATIM campus, Kawmzawl, Lunglei.

6) On 18th April, 2023 (Wednesday) the Department observed *World Heritage Day (also called International Day for Monuments and Sites* in which the two history students, Reuben Remruatfela and Vanlalbiakfeli delivered a speech on the theme for the observed Day – **'Heritage and Climate'.** The long-awaited Museum for the Department of History was also inaugurated by Vuansanga Vanchhawng, Principal.

7) As a department, mentoring system *(Mentee-Mentor system)* of History students functioned regularly which created a close relationship between the mentor (Faculty) and mentee (students). The mentee (s) were advised on their improvement both in their studies and personal life.

BOOKS FOR HISTORY: During the 2022-23 academic session the Department had 54 new books for History subject. Presently, there are 493 volumes related to History subject in the College Library.

The Department of Psychology was established in 2020 as a full-fledged department and is now seeing its third year. The department is devoted to promoting mental health awareness and to imparting essential life skills and practical knowledge for all-around development. Throughout the program, the main goal is to provide students with an understanding of their behavior, how to interact with and influence others, and their roles in society as responsible citizens as well as emphasizing ethical conduct in research and practices. Additionally, the course offers practical activities that will enrich the student's skills and knowledge of using various psychological tools for assessment. Further, the course integrates project work that enhances students' research skills.

The department will reach a major milestone by having its first graduating class this academic year (2022-2023). In addition, the department also has a promising number of students who will major in psychology in the coming years.

DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES:

Following are the activities the Department of Psychology have taken during the past year:

1) Interactive program with Ms. Lalrinmawii (Amawii):

A short interactive session was held on the 29th August 2022 with famous musician Ms. Lalrinmawii (Amawii), vocalist of the band Matilda and the Quest, who is a Psychology PhD scholar at Mizoram University. The session focused on Psychology and music. The session was attended by members of the band Cassettes, students from Psychology and Education departments, as well as faculty members from various departments.

2)Post-it Note event in observance of World Suicide Prevention Day:

In observance of World Suicide Prevention Day, the department organized a "Postit note" event on 9th September 2022, where students could write hopeful and uplifting messages and post them on a board for others to see. The event was organized in accordance with the theme of World Suicide Prevention Day, "Creating hope through action".

The objective of the event was to create a fun and meaningful way to promote awareness around mental health, suicide prevention and stigma reduction by writing messages of support. The messages served as a way to boost self-esteem, bring the students together and create a positive learning environment. The event concluded very successfully with a total of 214 entries.

3) Photography, Poster making & Logo Competition:

In preparation for World Mental Health Day, 10th October 2022, the Department of Psychology organized various competitions. Publicity regarding the competitions was announced on the 11th of September 2022 via posters that were put up in various department classrooms and offices. The themes for the competition were in line with the theme of World Mental Health Month: "Make mental health for all a global priority".

The Photography and Poster competition was open to all students, faculty, and staff. The logo competition was limited to the students of the Department of Psychology. The competitions received a good number of entries. Prizes were distributed on the 21st of October 2022 during the community assembly.

4) Departmental Parent-teacher meeting:

For the first time, an offline Parent-teacher meeting was conducted with the parents of Psychology core final year students on the college campus on the 30th January 2023 at HATIM campus. Presentations were given by the faculty regarding academics, especially Field Report which is a partial requirement for completion of their course, as well as career awareness and guidance. This meeting was organized to have a closer working relationship with the parents of our students as well as a chance to inform the parents about the curricular activities of the department.

5) Career counseling session:

On the 17th of February 2023, the department organized a career counseling session for all students of psychology (core and elective). The session was headed by Ms. H. Rinmuanawmi. The session was organized to introduce the students to different career options available in the field of psychology.

6) Internship programme (field report):

In accordance with their course requirements, the final- year students went on an internship programme guided by faculty members- Ms. H. Rinmuanawmi and Ms. R. Lalfamkimi. The students went to Child Guidance Centre located in Laipuitlang, Aizawl for an internship programme. The students were divided into two groups, with each group spending a week for the internship. At the centre, the students were able to attend theory classes as well as practical activities to enhance their knowledge about the different childhood disorders, their treatments and rehabilitation.

Circulation Service

The main characteristic and nature of the circulation service are the charging and discharging of books. This Circulation Desk Service is the main user's service point, its main function is lending materials to library users, checking in materials return, Monitoring materials for damage, and routing them to the appropriate staff for repair or replacement, etc. In this service, students can borrow 5 books at a time for 15 days and a fine is imposed for late submission of books at Rs. 2 per book per day. Faculty are given the privilege to borrow 10 books at a time for 30 days, and a fine overdue is imposed same as with students.

Reprographics Service

Today, reprographic service plays a vital role in the transmission of knowledge in library resources and services. Photocopying of the information is the main work of the reprographic unit. Photocopying, printing, and scanning facilities are available in the library. Photocopy and printing charges are taken from the students, staff, and faculty at a subsidized rate.

Student Orientation Program

The student orientation program is one of the activities that we have every year and this is a must for newly admitted students to get to know more about the library rules and regulations, to familiarize the users with the environment of the library. The members of the library should get acquainted with the environment, its collection, and its physical location, the tools that provide access to the collection, and the types of services offered by the library.

Reference Service

Library reference service is also one of the significant services in our library. Reference collections like Books and student project works are made available for reference only and we have a little collection that contain useful facts and information, such as Dictionaries, Encyclopedia Britannica, Year Book, etc.

Special collection

This new academic session we have a newly introduced special collection, in which some specialized documents are collected for the students so that they could venture out into the outside world for sharpening and shaping themselves and engage in a competitive world in which we have collected latest current affairs, difference subject material for UPSC, MPSC, and Bank POs examinations, etc.





VANLALNGHAKA HNAMTE Laboratory Technician

An early highlight of the year was the opening of the new Computer Laboratory in the Academic Block-C Building along with the Language Laboratory. Furniture and Rooms are designed to achieve the needs and to keep up with ongoing advances in technology. All types of equipment are set up having in mind the students can learn and improve their innovation by providing them standard environment.

This facility consists of a teaching area equipped with 31 Microsoft Windows machines. Laboratory's Technical Unit was strengthened by the appointment of a Laboratory Assistant, bringing the total strength of this unit to Two to deal with the growing complexity of systems software and to cope with the backlog of work in the information systems area for the whole College. The new appointment is a very welcome recognition, by the College, of both the importance of the role which Information Technology now plays in HATIM and of the enormous pressure on the Computer Laboratory's resources. MBMP(Mizoram Baptist Mipa pawl) of BCM graciously donated 10 Computer Systems to the IT Center of HATIM for the skills development of students, Teachers, and staff alike.

Some further progress was made in expanding the College Internet network by extending our Network to several buildings.

Language Laboratory:

This laboratory is used by students from the Department of English. The lab boasts of a network running on the Sonako server on the dedicated server that is attached/networked to 9 individual workstations for students. All computers are upgraded with the latest versions of Software. All workstations are equipped with headphones for voice communications.

The HATIM Evangelical Wing, HEW came into existence on 20th August 2008 at the Principals (HATIM) office, Chanmari-III, Lunglei. During the time of Madam Chawngthanpari, the 1st Principal of HATIM and founder of HEW. The first President was Mr. H. Lalruatkima. It was established as a wing to assist in fulfilling the objectives of the principles of which the foundations of HATIM were laid.

HEW is a wing under HATIM, and not an independent body like other EU units; therefore, all the students of HATIM are HEW members by default and it is mandatory to attend the services. The HATIM Evangelical Wing is one of the most important bodies of the college that takes care of the Worship Services and works for the inspiration and nourishment of the spiritual life of the community. It has taken up the initiative of the Sunday Afternoon English Service since 17th August 2008 till date.

It was affiliated with the Union of Evangelical Students of India (UESI) in the year 2013. However, there was an active interaction and involvement with the UESI only since 2016, when the HEW leaders attended the SLTC camp.

REGULAR FEATURES OF HEW:

The HATIM Evangelical Wing being one of the most important bodies of the college, takes care of the worship Services and works for the inspiration and nourishment of the spiritual life of the community. It has taken up the initiative of the Sunday Afternoon English Service since 17th August 2008 till date.

HEW conducts English Worship Service every Sunday Afternoon during normal Academic sessions. Different school children and local youth groups used to join the service from time to time.

HEW along with HATIM Authority used to organize Advance Christmas, Spiritual Nurturing, Palm Sunday, Good Friday, and Easter programs every year where each Program has a theme and a Speaker.

For the HEW Executive Committee members, Outing/Bethel/retreat used to be organized every year.

HEW used to organize different charity programs for different Homes and Centres.

The students contribute certain amounts of money and old clothes for those reasons. This has been a tradition every year. HEW used to organize charity for sick students now and then.

Activities as HEW:

The HEW visited different churches and introduce ourselves. The HEW participate in MTKP Inkhawmpui in the year 2010. HEW led praise and worship at the Baptist Youth Federation of India (BYFI) Conference at Serkawn church in the year 2015.

From 2016 till then every year HEW leaders attend a State Leadership Training camp.

In the year 2019, the HEW hosted State Leadership Training Camp at our HATIM campus, and in the year 2020, HEW organized Evangelistic Camp through the ZOOM app (online) under the guidance of the Union of Evangelical Students of India.

MAIN ACTIVITIES FROM JULY, 2021 TILL MARCH, 2022:

During this tenure, most of the HEW activities are conducted online due to the outbreak of Covid-19.

1. Handover of charges.

On 17th July 2021, charges were handed over to the Office Bearers of the HEW for the year 2021-22.

2. Orientation program with UESI in August.

Briefings for the Office Bearers were made during the program where Mr.PM Philip, Staff Worker, UESI took up the task of orientation.

- 3. Monthly Contribution to UESI.An amount of Rs. 1,000 is contributed to the UESI every month by the HEW.
- 4. Conduct monthly Bible study for HEW.

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Every 2nd Saturday of every month, the HEW conducted an online Bible Study inviting resource persons of different Evangelical Graduates Fellowship (EGF) members.

5. Conducting weekly online prayer meetings.

As the pandemic had compelled us to stay out of the hostels, face-to-face meetings could not be conducted and thus, Prayer meetings were conducted online every week on Tuesday through Google Meet using the HEW Google Meet account. For this meeting, prayers contribution was also made available to the community through 'Google Forms'.

6. Host online Evangelistic camp for the Southern region in collaboration with UESI.

The HEW with anticipations and planning with the UESI, Mizoram, conducted an online Evangelistic Camp for the students of the Southern Part of Mizoram where different colleges such as Hnahthial Govt. College... were also invited.

7. Attending SLTC, CMTC, and DTC (OBs and executive committee members).

State Leadership Training Camp (SLTC), Committee Membership Training Camp (CMTC) and Discipleship Training Camp (CMTC) were conducted online where the OBs and Executive Committee Members and the Worship Team members were attending as campers.

8. Organizing online one-day retreat.

On 5th February 2022, the HEW conducted a One Day Retreat Online through Google Meet inviting resource persons of different EGF members. The theme of the Retreat was "Rise and Shine with Jesus" Isaiah 60:1.

About RRC: Red Ribbon Club (RRC) is an inclusive promotional and preventive intervention to boost voluntary blood donation as well as mainstream HIV & AIDS prevention, care & support and treatment impact, mitigation, and stigma reduction, among the youth in educational institutions. Additionally, it will train and support teenage peer educators both inside and outside of the campuses.

Goal: To promote peer-to-peer HIV prevention messaging and to give young people a safe place to ask questions and get answers to their doubts, Red Ribbon Clubs are starting to form in colleges and other institutions. These clubs aim to dispel HIV/AIDS myths and encourage peer-to-peer messaging on HIV prevention.

RRC in HATIM: Due to constant administrative changes and financial constraints, it is difficult to trace the history of RRC in HATIM in terms of actual appointments, structures, and activities. Nevertheless, beginning in 2020, RRC, HATIM has been integrated with NSS Unit, HATIM till March, 2022, when a separate committee is formed and Mr.R.Lallianzela, Asst Professor, Dept of Social Work, is appointed as the Nodal Officer of RRC, HATIM. The committee members are 02 male and 02

female delegates each from HATIM Students Union (HSC) and HATIM Evangelical Wing (HEW) (HEW). The Mizoram State Aids Control Society (MSACS) provides funding for RRC HATIM, which has a separate bank account (MSACS).

STALLS / COUNTERS:

Various stalls and other counters were opened and managed by different interest clubs and interested vendors. A total of 40-45 stalls are constructed during the festival to showcase and display various activities and items. 17 stalls were rented

by vendors outside the college community. All these stalls were open to the public Stall owners have shown their creative work and achievements in their stalls and their products were available for sale.

The various activities put forward by different clubs and vendors for the festival are as follows.

- · Food Stalls
- · Handicraft / Arts and Crafts Stall
- Cultural Stalls which include Mizo traditional games and activities.
- Face Painting
- Fete Stalls which include various games and activities
- · Photo Booth / Photography Stall

- College Merchandise / Souvenir Shop
- Fitness Stalls which include health and fitness-related activities
- · Adventure Stalls which include adventure games
- · Ropeway / Zipline managed by Adventure Club
- · Haunted House
- · Children's Play Area

These stalls are open throughout the festival even when the activities are going on the main stage. A survey was conducted on all the stalls for their feedback, sales and number of visitors. All the stalls saw many visitors and the revenue generated was higher than expected by all the vendors. Most of the stall owners wanted to participate in the next festival based on their performance and sales during the festival.

ATTENDANCE:

The number of visitors during the festival was recorded by the Fitness Club which was in charge of Security and Traffic management. Duty personnel were assigned at the main gate for entrance records. On the first day, i.e. 17th March, 2023 the total attendance recorded is 1300 persons. On the second day, i.e. 18th March, 2023 the total attendance recorded is 1692 persons.

So, during the two days of the festival, there were approximately 3000 visitors from outside the campus. This number is counted excluding the staff and students which are approximately 450. So, in total the festival is attended by around 3450 persons, which is a very high number for a town such as Lunglei. The attendance alone shows the success of the festival.

FUNDING / SPONSORSHIP:

The estimated budget of this festival is Rs. 2,50,000 out of which 70% was funded by the college (HATIM). Local sponsors contribute around 10% of the total budget. A concept paper was submitted to Mizoram Rural Bank (MRB) for sponsorship for the event. MRB became the main sponsor and contributed 20% of the total estimated budget (Rs. 50,000) as a part of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR). 3rd (NH) Bn Assam Rifles were the co-sponsor for the event and contributed the prize money for Band and Solo competitions.

A total of 20 local sponsors also contributed to the event. These local sponsors are OG, Lucy Bakes, Hannah Transport, Jailhouse Rock, Pi Hmuaki Ice-cream (M&J ICE CREAM), MM Digital, Raymond Tailoring, Vanram Electricals, 199 Bn BSF, LR Aluminium & Steel Fabrications, HeavenSweets, Grill Inn, Solomon's HSS, Mizo Dawr, TBZ Enterprise, Fidelia Honda, Mr. Tlangvaltea Automobiles Center, SR Home Concept, Leitlang Pictures and PHE Lunglei.

The Committee of Creativity and Innovations formed an organizing committee consisting of the students and faculty as ex-officio members to carry out various tasks and make necessary arrangements for the success of the festival. The Organizing Committee took necessary actions, make plans and budgets, and proposals for various events for the festival. The plans and proposals were submitted to the Committee of Creativity and Innovations for approval. This organizing committee assigned specific roles and responsibilities to different teams which functioned actively during the preparation and the main events of the festival. The success of the festival relies greatly upon the active participation and functioning of the organizing committee.

Also, it proves that youth are yearning to learn if they are given a platform, and it is still possible to conduct such an event without drug and alcohol abuse. It is a great success in terms of nurturing the talents and creativity of the youths and looking at the results, it proves Hill Fest is a wonderful opportunity to build and shape the talents of youth which the college strongly believes will serve the greater good of our society. The number of positive feedback from different persons indicates the success of the rationale of the festival.

The college Eco-club is officially registered under Mizoram Pollution Control Board under the scheme National Green Corps (NGC) sponsored by Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF&CC), Govt. of India on February, 2022 with registration number NGC (C) /MIZ/22/25. Eco Clubs play an important role in creating environmental awareness amongst the students and staff of HATIM. The Club is an institutionally inspired voluntary club that promotes the participation of students and teachers in knowing and improving our environment. It aims at conservation, protection and management of the environment, essential for achieving sustainable living and development.

The Club has been set up with the purpose to create mass awareness and to incorporate as many people as possible for understanding our environment better. Moreover, Eco Club allows the students and the teachers to come out of the classroom specificity and notice the world more closely.

Eco Club ensures that it is the time to look closely at nature for greener and safer tomorrow.

The objectives of The Eco Club are as follows:

i. To arouse love and responsibility towards nature.

ii. To create an awakening in the young minds for preserving and conserving the natural environment and to make them more sensitive towards surroundings.

iii. To motivate the students to keep their surroundings green and clean by undertaking the plantation of trees.

iv. To promote the ethos of conservation of water by minimizing the use of water.

v. To motivate the students to imbibe habits and lifestyle for minimum waste generation, source separation of waste and disposal of the waste at the nearest storage point.

vi. To educate the students to create awareness amongst public and sanitary workers, to stop the indiscriminate burning of waste that causes respiratory diseases.

vii. To sensitize the students to minimize the use of plastic bags, and not to discard them in public places as they choke drains and sewers, causing water logging and providing a breeding ground for mosquitoes.

viii. To involve Eco Club students in open-orientation programmes in schools and public areas and to organize tree plantation programmes, awareness programmes through quizzes, essays, painting competitions, rallies, etc., regarding various environmental issues and educating children about re-use of waste material and preparation of products out of waste.

ix. To create awareness of biodiversity conservation and local environmental issues among all.

x. To create a 'clean and green consciousness' among students through various innovative methods.

Activities of the club are as follows:

1) 28th March, 2022 - A cleanliness drive was organized by Eco-club, HATIM. The club members along with the teachers in charge cleaned the Eco Garden on the college campus. 130 Dokimos

2) 29th March, 2022 – A signboard was erected at the Eco Garden by the club members along with the teacher-in-charge and other faculties. The signboard was put up on the college campus to identify the Eco Garden in the college campus.

3) 22nd April, 2022 - The Eco-club members of HATIM observed the 52nd Earth Day "Invest In our Planet" by disseminating Pamphlets/flyers through social media. Eco-club members are informed to post or make a status through WhatsApp, Facebook and Instagram with hashtag #investinourplanet and #earthday It was also posted on our college's official WhatsApp, Facebook and Instagram account to encourage more people to protect and safeguard mother earth and its species by improving our way of managing the waste. We chose "Solid Waste Management" among different pamphlets as a topic for Earth Day.

4) 24th June, 2022 - The Eco-Club members of HATIM observed International Day for Biological Diversity "Building a shared future for all life" on 24th June, 2022 at the College Auditorium. Since the Date falls on Sunday, we could not observe it on the exact date. Miss C. Lalrinsangi teacher-in-charge of the Eco-club, HATIM led the program and give a presentation among the student. She addresses the club member, the origin, the importance of Biodiversity and the steps we need to consider to sustain the life of all living creatures. 21 members are attending the program and it was such an eye-opening and challenging program in which everyone could take part to prolong and build a healthier environment for all creatures.

5) 16th September, 2022 - On the occasion of World Ozone Day, students of Eco Club with the guidance of the teacher in-charge put up handmade posters around the college to spread awareness. A Signatory Pledge prescribed was held at Student Center, the pledge was printed on the banner and those who were making a vow towards the protection of Ozone put up their signatures on the banner. Several eco club members also participated in an Online quizcompetition organized by Mizoram ENVIS hub.

6) 6th October, 2022 - The Eco Club HATIM in collaboration with IQAC HATIM held a painting, drawing and sketching competition in observation of the National Wildlife Conservation Week which is observed every year in India from the 2nd to the 8th of October. The turnout and submission surprised us as the creativity and thematic representation were all very expressive and to the point. There were 12 participants in the competition.

7) 7th October 2022 – On the occasion of 68th National Wildlife Week, a program was organized by Lunglei Forest Division in collaboration with IQAC

and Eco Club HATIM on the theme "Climate Change and Wildlife Conservation" at HATIM Auditorium. On this occasion a well-prepared PowerPoint presentation was presented by the DFO and RO, Lunglei Division on the topics:

- (a) Importance of flora and fauna
- (b) Awareness of climate change
- (c) Pictures of different animals

On the same day, the prize distribution of the on-the-spot painting competition was held.

8) 3rd February, 2023 – Declaration of Single-Use Plastic Free campus was held at the college campus. The program was organised by the Eco Club in collaboration with the IQAC.

9) 4th May, 2023 – Cherry trees were planted at the Eco Garden by the club members along with teacher-in-charge

Rural camp means the Social Work students stay in a rural village for experience and to make a study of the different elements and structures of the village. Rural camp provides a platform to students for creating awareness on various social issues among rural masses. It helps the students in understanding the core of rural social life, their problems and needs and to help them in preparing a plan for social work practice. The selection of the Camp was done by the camp leaders with the help of the faculty leaders. According to the discussion and understanding, a rural village called Cherhlun was chosen for the rural camp.

Due the covid-19 pandemic the government does not permit any social activities. In this case, the department cannot conduct rural camp on time which was supposed to be during the 3rd Semester i.e, 2021-2022. So, the 11th rural camp was conducted on 19 to 26 September 2022 along with the 3rd semester in the same village i.e.Cherhlun.

Cherhlun community was divided into 2 braches i.e Bethlehem Branch Cherhlun and Cherhlun Branch. Consequently both the semesters followed the division of the 2 YMA Branches accordingl: the 3rd semester conducting rural camp in Bethlehem Branch Cherhlun and the 5th Semester conducting their rural camp on Cherhlun Branch. They were given 1 month for the camp preparations. The expenditures for the camp were all calculated beforehand – transportations, mess, sports, souvenir, etc. As they needed the sponsorship from the NSS HATIM, they had also helped them in their service and in turn the NSS HATIM gave those dustbins which later were given to the village community. For the purpose of conducting 1 day free clinic, the student of III & V semesters collaborated with Christian Hospital Serkawn, Lunglei. They also received medicines, donated by the 3rd Naga Assam Rifle which is supposed to be given to the patients who were attending 1 day free clinic.

The total strength of campers were 27 in total along with the supervisor, Sir Rosangliana Khiangte. All the campers were exceedingly zealous and whole heartedly executed their duties which are assigned for them.

10:00 a.m – 6:30 p.m : 1 day free clinic was organised by III & V Semester in Public Health Centre, Cherhlun in collaboration with Christian Hospital Serkawn. 2 doctors, 1 lab technicians and 1 nurse came from Christian Hospital Serkawn. Around 240 patients came for medical check-up and provided a free medicines to the patients.

Day 5 (23rd September 2022)

10:00 a.m – 2:00 p.m : The campers visited Cherhlun Gospel Centenary School and Cherhlun High School. The campers were having interaction and activities with the students of the school visited.

INTRODUCTION

Rural Camp is one of the components of the field practicum for the III Semester students of the *Department of Social Work*. The students stayed in the village to study the different elements and structures of the village. It helps the students to identify, understand and assess the challenges faced by the rural areas as well as their social life and basic needs. It allows the students to apply theoretical knowledge into practice.

The camp was held for eight (8) days starting from 19th September to 26th September 2022 at Cherhlun, Hnahthial District. The campers departed from the college campus at 9:04 am on 19th September, 2022 by college Bus. The day scholars were picked up at Falkawn. And reached Cherhlun by 5:02pm.

The *Young Mizo Association* (YMA) Cherhlun Bethlehem Branch prepared a meal for the campers on the day they arrived.

OBJECTIVES OF RURAL CAMP:

- 1. To profile the community.
- 2. To promote an understanding of community needs, problems, and strength.

3. To enhance students' knowledge and skills in working with groups and community.

4. To develop possible social work interventions.

PRIMING FOR RURAL CAMP:

The college funded the Rural Camp with a total amount of Rs.25000. The students then contributed class fund for the rural camp. Besides contributing to the class fund, the students of the *Bachelor of Social Work* III Semester joined hands together for fundraising during the college week by selling fresh lemonades and fruits. They identify the Community through phone calls and virtual mode and the expenditures for the camp were all calculated beforehand. They also received sponsorship from *Red Ribbon Club HATIM* unit and *The National Service Scheme* (NSS) HATIM Unit. The students in turn help them in their services by organizing a cleanliness drive program and Sensitization Program during the rural camp. The transportation for the camp was arranged by the college and students were dropped off and picked up by the college Bus.

The campers were 21 in total and were guided by 2 supervisors namely Mr. RTC. Lalremruata (Asst. Professor) and Ms. LP.Lalnunhlui (Asst. Professor). The Camp leaders were elected by the students and they were divided into Six subcommittees under the supervision/ leadership of the Camp Leader and Asst. Camp Leader. Each Committee are assigned roles and responsibility in order to attain the rural camp objective.

2. Transact Walk: Transact walk was conducted on 20th September 2022 under the guidance of Bethlehem Cherhlun YMA president Mr. Zakhuma. They visited the important venue of the community that would be important for their Rural Camp studies.

3. Cleanliness Drive: Cleanliness drive was held on 20th September evening within Bethlehem Branch, Cherhlun.

Dustbins they received from NSS HATIM unit were handed over to Cherhlun Bethlehem Branch YMA president by the camp leaders to utilize for any purposeful matters.

4. Awareness: Sensitization program was held in Cherhlun Higher Secondary School on 21st September 2022 in collaboration with Excise and Narcotics and Red Ribbon Club Hatim Unit on the topic of DRUG AWARENESS and HIV AWARENESS respectively.

5. PRA: Participatory Rural Appraisal was conducted with YMA, MUP, MHIP VC and Church leaders on 21st September night and the data collected were a Social

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Map, Seasonal Diagram, Service and Opportunities Map, Pair Wise Ranking, and Timeline of the community.

6. Free Clinic: On 22nd September, 2022 Free clinic was held at Cherhlun PHC in collaboration with Christian Hospital Serkawn and III Naga Hill Assam Rifle. Medical checkups and dental checkups were hosted partly free of cost for the community.

7. School visit: The team categorized themselves into 3 groups and visited High School, Primary and Middle School. They conducted some activities for the students on 23rd September, 2022.

8. Movie Night: Movie Night was hosted for the community children on 23rd September, 2022. Their main aim is to build a good rapport with them.

9. One Day Sport: One day sport was conducted on 24th of September, 2022 with the community and different disciplines were conducted like Football, Volleyball Mixed and Relay Race.

10. Church Service: The Campers attended the morning Church Service at Bethlehem Branch Cherhlun. Mementos were handed to the Church Chairman Mr. Mc. Lalduhthanga. Afternoon worship Service was also conducted by the Campers with the KNP Unit. Action songs were taught to them. Fun and games were also hosted and the Bible was distributed among the children.

11. Survey: A survey was also conducted. To have a better understanding of the community.

The sample size for this survey was 63 households out of 76.
